Joy was born at home just outside of Wilson, Texas on October 23, 1935 as Joy Juanelle Corley. She was the sixth child of Willie Bran and Nellie Irene Corley.

Joy had 4 brothers and 2 sisters. Her family lived on a large ranch/farm and Joy grew-up doing the chores as any girl would do in this environment. The chores Joy liked were feeding the chickens and gathering the eggs, tending to the squirrels, cooking in the kitchen and sewing. Joy didn't like hoeing, picking cotton, she also didn't like riding the side in the fields, or boiling and wringing the laundry.

She entered the first grade in a small two-room country schoolhouse, "Dixie School House", at 5 years old. Joy and her future husband Duwaine walked and rode horses together to and from school all through 8th the grade.

Joy loved to ride her bike and her horse Dolly with Duwaine and her brothers O.B. and Dewey. She loved working with her mom in the kitchen and also enjoyed quilting.

Joy was a talented basketball player and was recruited in the 8th grade to play on the high school varsity team where she played until she graduated high school. She was MVP of many high school games as well as MVP at the Regional State Championship in 1949.

Joy grew up in a Primitive Baptist Community that didn't believe in dancing. One time in high school Joy and 7 of her best friends got caught dancing behind the stage curtain and received a spanking from the principal.

Joy was a high school cheerleader except during her basketball season when she was needed to be a star on the court. She was a member of the "Future Homemakers of America Club" and the "Sewing and Quilting Club.

It was in high school when Joy and Duwaine started secretly dating. Joy's parents let her brother O.B. take Joy to the picture show in town, but wouldn't let her date because she was too young. In town they would meet up with Duwaine and double date.

AT THE GRAVE.

In 1963 Lori was born and Joy spent the next part of her life raising her family and building a loving home.

During this time, Joy loved to spend time riding horses, camping, traveling in the motorhome, and spending time with friends at the river. Joy's favorite quiet time included reading and music. She loved to listen to country music and at times enjoyed playing the piano.

When her family was grown she enjoyed spending time with her family especially the grandkids at their cabin in New Mexico and at their condo in Palm Desert. Joy traveled with Duwaine on business around the world meeting and enjoying many friends.

Joy was a loving and respectful woman who always put others before herself. She led her life with dignity and was completely devoted to Duwaine and her family. Joy was a loving wife, mother and grandmother.

The Lord be with you.

Answer. And with thy spirit.

REMEMBER thy servant **Joy**, O Lord, according to the favour which thou bearest unto thy people, and grant that, increasing in knowledge and love of thee, she may go from strength to strength, in the life of perfect service, in thy heavenly kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost ever, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

THEREFORE are they before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple: and he that sitteth on the throne shall dwell among them.

They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; neither shall the sunlight on them, nor any heat.

For the Lamb which is In the midst of the throne shall feed them, and shall lead them unto living fountains of waters; and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes.

The Order for The Burial of the Dead

The service will be from the 1928 Book of Common Prayer, printed in facsimile form herein

I AM the resurrection and the life, saith the Lord: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: and whosoever liveth and believeth in me, shall never die.

I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth: and though this body be destroyed, yet shall I see God: whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not as a stranger.

We brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. The LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD.

St. John xi. 21-27

MARTHA said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha said to him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world."

Let us say together the Nicene Creed, which forms the statement of Christian faith:

I BELIEVE in one God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, And of all things visible and invisible: And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God; Begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of very God; Begotten, not made; Being of one substance with the Father; By whom all things were made: Who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, And was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, And was made man: And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried: And the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures: And ascended into heaven, And sitteth on the right hand of the Father: And he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the quick and the dead; Whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Ghost, The Lord, and Giver of Life, Who proceeded from the Father and the Son; Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; Who spake by the Prophets: And I believe one Catholic and Apostolic Church: I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins: And I look for the Resurrection of the dead: And the Life of the world to come. Amen.

¶ To be said by all,
O saving Victim, open wide
the gate of heaven to man below;
our foes press on from every side;
thine aid supply; thy strength bestow.

All praise and thanks to thee ascend
for evermore, blest One in Three;
O grant us life that shall not end
in our true native land with thee.

THE LORD is my shepherd; *I shall not want.
He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: *he leadeth me
beside the still waters.

He restoreth my soul: *he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness
for his name's sake.
Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I
will fear no evil: *for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they
comfort me.

Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies:
*thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over.
Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life:
*and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost;
Answer. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,
world without end. Amen.
