Propers

Each Sunday there are Propers: special prayers and readings from the Bible. There is a Collect for the Day; that is a single thought prayer, most written either before the re-founding of the Church of England in the 1540s or written by Bishop Thomas Cranmer, the first Archbishop of Canterbury after the re-founding.

The Collect for the Day is to be read on Sunday and during Morning and Evening Prayer until the next Sunday. The Epistle is normally a reading from one of the various Epistles, or letters, in the New Testament. The Gospel is a reading from one of the Holy Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The Collect is said by the minister as a prayer, the Epistle can be read by either a designated reader (as we do in our church) or by one of the ministers and the Holy Gospel, which during the service in our church is read by an ordained minister.

The propers are the same each year, except if a Red Letter Feast, that is one with propers in the prayerbook, falls on a Sunday, then those propers are to be read instead, except in a White Season, where it is put off. Red Letter Feasts, so called because in the Altar Prayerbooks the titles are in red, are special days. Most of the Red Letter Feasts are dedicated to early saints instrumental in the development of the church, others to special events. Some days are particularly special and the Collect for that day is to be used for an octave (eight days) or an entire season, like Advent or Lent.

The Propers for today are found on Page 203-204, with the Collect first:

The Tenth Sunday after Trinity.

The Collect.

LET thy merciful ears, O Lord, be open to the prayers of thy humble servants; and, that they may obtain their petitions, make them to ask such things as shall please thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

The Epistle came from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, the Twelfth Chapter beginning at the First Verse. Paul starts off by telling us that no man who "speaketh by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Ghost." He goes on to say, "Now there are diversities of gifts, but by the same Spirit." "...it is the same God which worketh all in all." Every one is gifted in one manner or another by God, the question really is not do you have a gift from God, but will you use it? Our gifts are so different in their character that we sometimes fail to recognize them for what they are, gifts from God, meant to be used, not ignored.

CONCERNING spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant. Ye know that ye were Gentiles, carried away unto these dumb idols, even as ye were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; to another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; to another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues: but all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will.

Today's Holy Gospel started in the Nineteenth Chapter of the Gospel according to St. Luke, beginning at the Forty-First Verse.

The Gospel tell of Jesus' time in the temple wherein he sees the people selling their wares having made the temple a den of thieves rather than a house of prayer and cast them out. He also predicts the fall of the temple saying it shall be laid "even with the ground, ... they shall not leave one stone upon another," because the people of the temple had rejected Jesus. The message to those who accept Jesus and his teaching is clear, their temple shall not fall. The message to those who will not hear his message will never be heard, let alone clear, their first indication of a problem will be when their temple falls.

Often people take this Gospel to preclude jumble sales at church. It does not preclude that. It does literally preclude cheating people at those jumble sales! You must understand that the "perfect" sacrificial offerings to God the temple hawkers were selling were perfectly defective "sacrificial lambs" which would be recycled over and over. Those buying were likely for the most part honest in their attempt to offer unto God that due Him, yet their effort was being diverted and redirected by those "in charge", the priests and hawkers. In their very successful effort to make money they were defrauding the people and insulting God in His own House. It should also be pointed out that a church should be a place of worship. It may be a Prophet Center, but not a Profit Center¹. If the building needs constant commercial enterprise, then perhaps the emphasis is on the wrong center. A church should be funded for its needs by its members and its wants should come much later, if not in fact unheeded. A church is about Him, not about IT.

A New Kind of King

*37 And when He was come nigh, even now at the descent of the mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen; 38. Saying, Blessed be the King that cometh in the name of the Lord: peace in heaven, and glory in the highest. 39. And some of the Pharisees from among the multitude said unto Him. Master, rebuke Thy disciples. 40. And He answered and said unto them, **I tell you that, if these should hold their peace, the stones would immediately cry out.** 41. And when He was come near, He beheld the city, and wept over it, 42. Saying, **If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! but now they are hid from thine eyes.** 43. For the days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side, 44. **And shall lay thee even with the ground, and thy children within thee; and they shall not leave in thee one stone upon another; because thou knewest not the time of thy visitation.** 45. And he went into the temple, and began to cast out them that sold therein, and them that bought; 46. Saying unto them, **It is written, My house is the house of prayer: but ye have made it a den of thieves.** 47. And He taught daily in the temple. But the chief priests and the scribes and the chief of the people sought to destroy Him, 48. And could not find what they might do: for all the people were very attentive to hear Him. (Luke 19:37-48)*



On this occasion, we read that Jesus wept - just as he had wept without the tomb of Lazarus. Just as He was not weeping for Lazarus (for He knew He would raise him), He wept for the faithless of those who did not know His power over death. The same is true here of Jerusalem. He sees the future and the consequence of those who proclaim Him King today, and in a few short days, call for His crucifixion.

This trip to Jerusalem is the last in the earthly ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ,

but, in spite of His knowing of His coming Crucifixion, His will is steadfast and unflinching. He "*went on before His disciples.*" A good leader always leads his men and does not follow in the safety of the rear echelon.

Luke 9:51 says, "*And it came to pass, when the time was come that he should be received up, he stedfastly set his face to go to Jerusalem .*" This is a rare form of courage that is beyond our understanding. In Luke's account of this event, the emphasis is upon the Royalty and Kingship of Christ.

The narrative brings into prominence Christ's part in originating the triumphal entry:

(vs. 30-34) He sent for the colt with the obvious intention of stimulating the people to just such a demonstration as followed. Notice the Lord's own preparation and command of the events to follow:

³⁰ Saying, Go ye into the village over against you; in the which at your entering ye shall find a colt tied, whereon yet never man sat: loose him, and bring him hither. ³¹ And if any man ask you, Why do ye loose him? thus shall ye say unto him, Because the Lord hath need of him. ³² And they that were sent went their way, and found even as he had said unto them. ³³ And as they were loosing the colt, the owners thereof said unto them, Why loose ye the colt? ³⁴ And they said, The Lord hath need of him. ³⁵ And they brought him to Jesus: and they cast their garments upon the colt, and they set Jesus thereon. ³⁶ And as he went, they spread their clothes in the way (Luke 19:30-36)

The nature of His dominion is as plainly taught by the humble pomp as is its reality. A pauper King, who makes His public entrance into His city mounted on a borrowed ass, with His followers' clothes for a saddle, attended by a shouting crowd of poor peasants, who for weapons or banners had but the branches plucked from other people's trees, was a new kind of king.

We do not need Matthew's quote of the prophet's vision of the meek King coming to Zion on an ass, to understand the contrast of this kingdom with such a dominion as that of Rome, or of such princes as the Herods. We see at the beginning of our text how the disciples and all the people began to praise Christ and welcome Him as King.

We witness a contrast here in the crowds of people: The Disciples proclaiming Him to be King, and the background filled with hostile spies. This was unlike any of his actions before. He had previously downplayed his role as King of Kings, but now knows the time is near to proclaim it out of the mouths of babes and commoners.

Look at this humble procession:

We have the humble procession with the shouting disciples and the background of hostile spies. The disciples eagerly caught at the meaning of bringing the colt, and threw themselves with alacrity into what seemed to them preparation for the public assertion of royalty, for which they had long been impatient.

Luke tells us that they lifted Jesus on to the seat which they hurriedly prepared, while some spread their garments in the way — the usual homage to a king:

How different the vision of the future in their minds and His! They dreamed of a throne; He knew it was a Cross. Round the southern shoulder of Olivet they came, and, as the long line of the Temple walls, glittering in the sunshine across the valley, burst on the view, and their approach could be seen from the city, they broke into loud acclamations, summoning, as it were, Jerusalem to welcome its King.

Let's examine verse 39: *And some of the Pharisees from among the multitude said unto Him. Master, rebuke Thy disciples.* The Pharisees were not there to add anything to the celebration. They were there to undermine Christ. They still do so! The modern pulpits are filled with men who are willing to allow Christ to be mentioned, only, "please do not make so very much of Him." They are always with us to deter us and prevent our full blossoming of Faith. Does the Gospel depend, in any respect, on the effort or presumptions of mere men?

Not at all. Whatsoever the Lord decrees, it shall come to pass.

If no man speaks the Word of Truth, then the very Stones will cry out! *41. And when He was come near, He beheld the city, and wept over it, Why did Christ weep over Jerusalem? He saw the future of that city. Forty years later. He saw the massed Roman Armies under Titus coming to encircle and to suffocate the City, He saw trenches dug about its perimeter and battlements erected against its walls. He saw the starving children within her besieged walls, and the inhabitants eating their young for famine.....andHe wept!*

At the moment of His triumphal entry, we see Him plunged into utter sorrow for the people of Jerusalem.

That sorrow is a sign of His real manhood, but it is also a part of His revelation of the very heart of God. The form is human, the substance divine.

The man weeps because God pities. Christ's sorrow does not hinder His judgments. The woes which wring His heart will nevertheless be inflicted by Him. Judgment is His 'strange work,' alien from His desires; but it *is* His work.

The eyes which are as a flame of fire are filled with tears, but their glance burns up the evil. Note the yearning in the unfinished sentence, 'If thou hadst known.' Note the decisive closing of the time of repentance. Note the minute prophetic details of the siege, which, if ever they were spoken, are a distinct proof of His all-seeing eye. And from all let us fix in our hearts the conviction of the pity of the judge, and of the judgment by the pitying Christ. *45. And he went into the temple, and began to cast out them that sold therein, and them that bought; 46. Saying unto them, It is written, "My house is the house of prayer: but ye have made it a den of thieves."*

I want each of you to imagine that this little church decided to abandon our policy of not conducting fund-raising enterprises. Suppose that we held a bake sale, or yard sale here in the yard of our church. Suppose many people were coming to buy our merchandise and we were looking at the hope of building a new edifice. "*Except the Lord buildeth the house, they labor in vain that buildeth it.*" Suppose a good man of the community (WHO OWNS A BAKERY) comes without warrant or warning and begins to turn our money tables over and chase us off the property with a cane.

How would we react? But that is exactly what Christ does in the Temple. The Church is not our private property to raise ill-gotten money. It belongs to God! He will provide the resources for its building by the love of the people, not their merchandising.

The Church is a House of Prayer and not merchandise. Let the other churches transgress His will, we shall not. If we remain poor in the treasures of the world, we will hold even more steadfastly to the treasures of Heaven! How was the reprimand of Christ received by the preachers of that community?

Read for yourselves: "*47. And He taught daily in the temple. But the chief priests and the scribes and the chief of the people sought to destroy Him, 48. And could not find what they*

might do: for all the people were very attentive to hear Him.'

Let us trust in the Lord for all our provision and we shall be well.

*Sermon – Reverend Jack Arnold - Time and Action
Church of the Faithful Centurion - Descanso, California*

Today's sermon tied the Collect, Epistle and Gospel together.



Consider the words from the Collect, wherein we ask God to give us ... be open to the prayers of thy humble servants; and, that they may obtain their petitions, make them to ask such things as shall please thee ...

Once again, this Collect is kind of a follow-on to last week's Collect. First, we ask God to hear our prayers, this is funny in that He always listens intently to us when we pray and we very seldom listen to Him when He answers. It is an odd paradox, He listens but we never seem to listen. It seems as if at times we should pray that we should listen not Him, as He always listens! Nonetheless, we ask His help to ask for those things we need, not those things we want and are bad for us. We need to be humble when we ask. What does that word mean? According to the dictionary, to be HUMBLE means to be:

- Modest
- Respectful
- Lowly

Modest - unassuming in attitude and behavior

Respectful - feeling or showing respect and deference toward other people

Lowly - relatively low in rank and without pretensions

We cannot change what is our station in life, but we can change our attitude towards God. He is God, we are not. We are His creatures, imperfect with free will. We must recognize that when we ask for His Help. We badly need the guidance from the Holy Ghost so we can ask for what we need, instead of what we want. NEED and WANT are two four letter words that are used to oft interchangeably that *do not* mean the same thing. People often use these four letter words erroneously, thinking they mean the same thing. They do not and cannot. Needs are vital for our spiritual health as well as physical health. Wants are nice things to have, but they are not vital for us to survive. When we think we "NEED" something, we have to ask if it fits the above definition "Is this vital for our ministry/life here on earth, or is it something that is just nice to have, but not a critical item?" We have to see if what we need is something we truly need, or just a want. Too many people do not perform this need analysis and as a result suffer for it physically and spiritually.

While our needs must be fulfilled, there is nothing wrong with wanting, just so long as you want things that are good for you. Once again, we are asking God to help us to want the right things that will be good for us and help us develop in our Christian lives. Paul reminds us that though each believer is different, throughout all the believing peoples of the Church the same God, the same Spirit, the same Christ works all in all and through all His work is done and accomplished. When we are setting off to do work for the church, we have to keep in mind that those believers we serve and help believe in the same God we do, and they are filled with the same spirit.

Paul reminds us that we each have differing talents, but if we use them to the Glory of God, without concern for who gets the credit, all will be well. I can think of no finer example of this than the Marines serving on Peleliu with Eugene Sledge, in the 3rd Battalion/5th Marines. I was reading his memoir, With the Old Breed, when I realized in my reading, none of the Marines he served with cared a bit who got a credit, but all they cared about was helping their fellow Marines get the objective done. They didn't do what they felt like, at least not the good ones. They did what was right without thought as to who would get the credit. Their main thoughts were to work as a team to defeat the Japanese. So too, must we work with our fellow Christians, as the Marines did on Peleliu, using each of our talents to further His work and to defeat the forces of Satan. There may be a lot of hardships to endure, just like the Marines endured, but if they could endure the hells of Peleliu, then surely we can endure whatever Satan can throw at us, if we just trust in Him and listen to Him. Do what you can, not what you feel like. Ignore what you feel like doing and do what God wants you to do. We will profit from doing what God wants more than if we did what we just felt like doing. What we feel like doing often does not align with what God wants for us, which can result in negative consequences for us. However, if we do what He wants for us, there will be positive consequences.

If you will but read the Bible, what God wants you to do will be clear. If you do your best to do His Will all will be well with you. Death is a pretty hollow threat if you do your duty. The people of Jerusalem would not have been in the pickle they got in when 70AD came along, had they only done what God wanted. But, it was too hard for them. In 70AD, what had been so hard seemed pretty easy compared to the fix they were in, but by then it was too late. By that time they were left with only "There are none so poor as cannot purchase a noble death." But, for most of them by that time they had no will. It left when they failed to follow God's will.

It is an object lesson for us, to do what we can in the here and now and not worry about tomorrow. And also we shouldn't complain if it is too hard for us, because being on God's side, nothing is too hard for us. We should ignore these thoughts and turn our attentions to what God wants for us. We must learn from the past mistakes of our spiritual forebears and resolve not to repeat those same mistakes. If we are ignorant of our spiritual past, we are doomed to make those very same mistakes.

When Luke wrote of the sales in the temple, he had a point. The point was not to preclude jumble sales at church. He was not abhorring the sales, but the cheating in the name of God. This Gospel does literally preclude cheating people at those jumble sales! You must understand the temple hawkers were selling perfect defective "sacrificial lambs" which would be recycled over and over². In their very successful effort to make money they were defrauding the people and insulting God in His own House. It should also be pointed out that a church should be a place of worship. It may be a Prophet Center, but not a Profit Center. If the building needs constant commercial enterprise, then perhaps the emphasis is on the wrong center. All of these churches that emphasize quantity over quality should be suspect. It does not matter the quantity, as long as you have a base of quality believers that serve the One Triune God. A church

² The concept of being truthful in the efforts we make to spread The Word is not a separate subject by any means, but would take more time to talk about than we have time for here. Suffice it to say that we must take every care to spread The Truth and not what our audience, whoever that may be, would like to hear. When we bring our "sacrifice" to the "temple" we needs make certain it is in fact as perfect as we can make it. This is so hard that one of the recurring themes of the Collects is asking for guidance to ask for the right things.

should be funded for its needs by its members and its wants should come much later, if not in fact unheeded. A church is about Him, not about IT. It should not be a self licking ice cream cone, but a center to help the believers walk in Christ, not focusing on the physical and material plant on earth, but on helping us on our own "Pilgrim's Progress" towards heaven. If it focuses on anything but that, it is a stumbling block to believers. We are not called to be a stumbling block, but to be guides, to be lanterns shining in the darkness, to be as a light cloud amidst the darkness of this world.

Do what you are supposed to do when you are supposed to do it. That is duty. It does not matter how you "feel" about black or white. Black is black; White is white. Do your duty. Work as hard as you can, do the best you can, trust in the Lord. By the way, cheat no one. If you follow that, you won't need to be told, "Particularly in God's House."

Action counts. For by their actions ye shall know them.

The time is now, not tomorrow. The time has come, indeed. How will you ACT?

Another of the Christian's fondest hopes is that Heaven will be a great and glad reunion with friends and family who have gone to Heaven before us, and who will come after us. Many popular Gospel songs talk of this. People often talk about it at funerals, and around the bedsides of dying loved ones. Most of us think about it when we think of those dear to us who have gone before us, and of those we will leave behind when we finally cross the river. Beneath all of this is the belief that we will recognise one another in Heaven. But this belief is not limited to "everyday Christians." Great theologians

have believed and cherished it too. Bishop, J.C. Ryle, believed it strongly. He wrote: "We shall once more see our beloved friends and relatives who fell asleep in Christ, and left us in sorrow and tears,-better, brighter, and more beautiful, more pleasant than ever we found them on earth" (Practical Religion, p. 436). Again, writing of our eternal happiness in Heaven, he wrote, we "are traveling on 'towards an eternal weight of glory,' towards a home that shall never be broken up, a meeting without parting, a family gathering without the separation" (Practical Religion, p. 476).

As you know, I would never commend the words of a theologian to you, if I did not believe they were in absolute accord with the teaching of Scripture. Therefore, I want to look at several passages of Scripture with you, and see if there is any support for this belief.

The first passages are in the Old Testament book of Genesis. All of them are about the passing of people out of this life, and all of them use a particular phrase. Genesis 25:17, "and he gave up the ghost and died; and was gathered unto his people." Genesis 35: 29, "And Isaac gave up the ghost, and died, and was gathered unto his people." Genesis 49:33, speaking of Jacob, says he, "yielded up the ghost, and was gathered unto his people." We find similar phrases throughout the Old Testament. I won't multiply verses, but we see a common phrase in the verses just quoted, and that phrase is, "gathered unto his people." The people in the Old Testament era did not have the complete Bible as we have. Consequently, there was much that they did not know about life after death. Many weren't even sure there is life after death. Job was angry and depressed because he believed there is nothing after life, and life is a depressing trail of tears. Therefore, he was angry at God, and tired of life. But we do see some kind of understanding of an afterlife in the verses I quoted, and however vague their understanding was, the Old Testament people believed in the continuance of the individual person, and that belief is expressed in these verses. They say the individual persons were gathered unto their people. They were not gathered into an impersonal mass. They were gathered into the company of other individual persons, who are described as their people. They are people they know and will recognise. So the Old Testament appears to teach that we will both know and be known by others in Heaven.

The next passage is in the New Testament, from the Gospel of Luke, the 16th chapter beginning at the 19th verse. It is the story of the rich man and Lazarus. I realise this story contains much symbolism, but I also believe our Lord does not distort truth for the sake of a story. So there is a true view of the afterlife in this passage. It is veiled, and we see it through a glass darkly, but it is also true. The first thing I note in this story is that individuality and personhood continue in the afterlife (23). Abraham is still Abraham. The rich man is still the rich man. Lazarus is still Lazarus. They have not become non-persons. They have not lost their identities. They remain who and what they were on earth. The second thing I note here is that they recognise each other. The rich man recognises Abraham. He even calls him by name, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me" (24). The rich man recognises Lazarus, he "seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom." Abraham recognises the rich man (25). Abraham even knows the life-story of both men. He tells the rich man he had his good things in life, while Lazarus received evil things. Evil, here means sorrows and sufferings, not immoral or sinful things. The point is that all three recognised and knew each other. A third thing I note here is that they are able to communicate with each other. The rich man is able to call out to Abraham, and Abraham is able to hear and reply to the rich man. So, somehow, we will be able to communicate with one another in the afterlife. I know

there are many questions and issues about this passage that I don't have time to deal with today. I simply want to say, based on it, we will recognise one another in Heaven.

I want to look at, what to me is a very important passage on this topic. It is Hebrews 12:1; "Wherefore, seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us." I want to focus on that great cloud of witnesses. In their context, these words refer back to those heroes of the faith, named and unnamed, in Hebrews 11. Those people have run the race of faith. They have finished the course. Now they are presented as people in the stands of a sporting arena. They are watching runners on the track. They watch each generation rise and fall. They watch each person take his place at the starting line. They watch us as we run our races. They see us fall. They see our weaknesses. They see that some stop running. Some give up the race. Some never cross the finish line. They are watching us. The course is not the race of life, it is the life of faith in Christ Jesus. We are on that track now. We are running that course. Will we finish the race? Will we be faithful to the end? Or will we give up because the race is long and difficult and we grow weary?

These are the questions raised in Hebrews 12:1. But I want to focus on the people in the stands. Again I say the witnesses are, first, the people in chapter 11. But I think, in a secondary sense, they are all who have finished the course. They are all who, as Paul wrote, have fought the good fight, finished the course, kept the faith, and received the crown of righteousness which the Lord gives to all who love His appearing (2 Tim 4:6-8). And one thing I think I see in this passage is that the people in the stands are still the same people they were when they lived on earth. They keep their personhood. Their individuality goes with them into Heaven. Abel is still Abel. Sarah is still Sarah. Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob are still Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

The next passage is 1 John 1:1-3, where John says "we" meaning the Apostles and the voice of the One, Holy, and Apostolic Church, declare to you what we have seen and heard and handled concerning the Word of life, meaning Jesus Christ and His Gospel. Verse 3 is the one I want to focus on because it tells us why they declare these things to us. They declare them unto us that we may have fellowship with them, and their fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ. Fellowship refers to a great and deep sharing together, and being part of, the blessings of God given to us through the ministry of Jesus Christ. We who are in Christ have a fellowship that is beyond anything else this world has to offer. We are members of Christ. We are members of His Body. We are members of one another. You are part of me, and I am part of you. This membership, this fellowship begins now, on earth, but is only partial here. We do not enjoy it in its fullest sense, as we will in Heaven. But notice this; we do not lose our identity in this fellowship. We continue to be ourselves. We are still the same person. We are different from the way we were before we became Christians. But we are still us. I do not see any place in the Bible that teaches us that our individuality will cease when we leave this world and enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Our fellowship will be fuller. Our fellowship will be complete in the sense that it cannot be improved or added unto. But it will not end. Fellowship, by definition, is a bond and relationship between two or more rational, identifiable persons, who recognise and intentionally form a bond and relationship. Rocks are not rational, identifiable persons. Rocks don't have fellowship, not even with other rocks.

Finally, I want to look at verses in the book of Revelation. First is Rev. 5:9 & 10. Here we see an untold number of people from every kindred and tongue and people and nation. Notice what happens to them. They are made kings and priests. They are not made into one king or one priest. They remain individuals. In 5:5, one of the elders meets John in Heaven and speaks to him, so someone in Heaven recognises and communicates with John

Let me conclude now by restating some of the conclusions I have drawn from the Scripture passages:

1. We retain our individuality in Heaven.
2. There is communication in Heaven. Abraham spoke to the rich man. The elder spoke to John.
3. People recognise each other in Heaven. Abraham recognised Lazarus. The elder recognised John.

So, will we know each other in Heaven? Yes. Will Heaven really be a glad reunion with loved ones who have died in Christ? Yes. It will be the greatest, happiest reunion we could ever imagine. We will see ancestors we never knew. We will see descendants yet unborn. We will see parents and spouses and children and aunts and uncles and cousins, and friends, as well as all the great heroes of the faith from the beginning to the very last day of earth. And this reunion will never end. No one ever has to leave the reunion to return to work. No one has to leave the family circle to start his own home and family. No one ever has to say good bye. And no one is ever taken away in death. Yes, we will know one another in Heaven. And, yes, the reunion will be glorious.

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Tenth Sunday after Trinity

9 August 2015, Anno Domini

Psalm 15, 46 • Isaiah 44:1-8, 21-23 • Romans 12:1-9

The Tenth Sunday after Trinity.

The Collect.

LET thy merciful ears, O Lord, be open to the prayers of thy humble servants; and, that they may obtain their petitions, make them to ask such things as shall please thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*



Psalm 15

LORD, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill?
He that walketh uprightly, and worketh righteousness, and speaketh the truth in his heart.

3 He that backbiteth not with his tongue, nor doeth evil to his neighbor, nor taketh up a reproach against his neighbor.

4 In whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but he honoreth them that fear the Lord. He that sweareth to his own hurt, and changeth not.

5 He that putteth not out his money to usury, nor taketh reward against the innocent. He that doeth these things shall never be moved.

Holiness

The overarching theme of our scripture is holiness. Who can live with the Lord? Why is the Lord so strong and is so holy? Why be holy?

Early church Fathers understood, especially from the writings of Leviticus and Deuteronomy that man had a severe flaw, he was filled with sin and needed outside help to overcome that sin.

In fact he was born into sin, because of Adam.

The psalmist wrote many times about the good man who avoided or fled evil (sin) and in this way they were worshiping the Lord. Many passages of both Old and Newtestament writings speak of the overall sinfulness of man. So how do we get out of this ?

The simple outline found in Psalm 15 guides us to seek holiness, to seek the Lord, to live at peace with our neighbors, and in doing these things he will not be shaken.

- A. Be blameless and do what is right. Walk according to the precepts we learn from the Ten Commandments. By reading and understanding how the Lord worked amongst a wicked people gives us the examples of how we should conduct ourselves in our daily lives.
- B. Speak the truth and do not slander others. That sounds like one of the Ten Commandments doesn't it? You don't have to say anything about someone else, their behavior will reveal what character flaws and possible evil that they may exhibit. You don't have to report, their lives will do all the talking. That is what is implied by this passage, in that if you speak the truth and do not slander others, you will reveal your Lord in your actions.
- C. Now you may despise a vile man, one who purposely seeks out evil and does evil to others, but this despising is to keep you away from that influence, not to drag you down to his level. And at the same time as you despise one who is vile, you should also honor won who fears or has great respect for the Lord God Almighty. This one who fears and honors the Lord, keeping his oath even if it hurts, they are the one to look up to, because they are doing the right thing.
- D. Interesting, this instruction is all about money, or funds. The person, who fears the Lord, lends his money without usury. Usury, a misunderstood word. It means that you can lend money without charging too much interest, not interest

free. In the middle ages the interpretation was that no interest could be charged for lending money, if you were a Christian. So monarchs and the church went to the Jewish population and borrowed money, because the Jews could charge interest. But we are getting off track here, back to the outline. The other side of this good man, one who feared the Lord, did not do usury and even more importantly, did not take bribes to “bear false witness against the innocent”.

^{E.} What is the benefit of doing all this that David wrote in Psalm 15?

He who does these things will never be shaken. The very sure foundation of our Lord God, our creator, our help, our sure way in the wilderness, He will keep us from being shaken.

Bridges falling down, mine disasters, drought, floods, terror threats on a daily basis, all these things can shake an ordinary person. But a person at peace, a person who is in love and concord with his neighbor, a person who is honest, a person who is kind, a person who stays away from evil and yet does what is right, he will not be shaken. All these terrible things can happen, they will continue until Jesus comes again in His Glory to claim his Kingdom, but in the meantime, we can stand up and not be shaken if we follow the simple outline of Psalm 15.

I leave you with a quote from our other Psalter reading, Ps 46:10

Be still, and know that I am God;
I will be exalted among the nations.
I will be exalted in the earth.”

Let us pray:

O GOD, who knowest the weakness and corruption of our nature, and the manifold temptations which we daily meet with; We humbly beseech thee to have compassion on our infirmities, and to give us the constant assistance of thy Holy Spirit; that we may be effectually restrained from sin, and excited to our duty. Imprint upon our hearts such a dread of thy judgments, and such a grateful sense of thy goodness to us, as may make us both afraid and ashamed to offend thee. And, above all, keep in our minds a lively remembrance of that great day, in which we must give a strict account of our thoughts, words, and actions; and according to the works done in the body, be eternally rewarded or punished, by him whom thou hast appointed the Judge of quick and dead, thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

O LORD, we join our unfeigned thanks for all thy mercies; for our being, our reason, and all other endowments and faculties of soul and body; for our health, friends, food, and raiment, and all the other comforts and conveniences of life. Above all, we adore thy mercy in sending thy only Son into the world, to redeem us from sin and eternal death, and in giving us the knowledge and sense of our duty towards thee. We bless thee for thy patience with us, notwithstanding our many and great provocations; for all the directions, assistance, and comforts of thy Holy Spirit; for thy continual care watchful providence over us through the whole course of our lives, and particularly for the mercies and benefits of the past day: beseeching thee to continue these thy blessings to us; and to give us grace to show our thankfulness in a sincere obedience to his laws, through whose merits and intercession we received them all, thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*



Rev Bryan Dabney of Saint John's Sunday Sermon

We are fortunate to have Bryan's Sunday Sermon. If you want people to come to The Truth, you have to speak the truth, expound the truth and live the truth. This is really a good piece and I commend it to your careful reading.



Tenth Sunday after Trinity

In today's Gospel, our Lord wept over Jerusalem and its people. How much he wept we are not told, but his words concerning what was to come upon that city must have been heart-rending indeed. This was not a warning so much as it was a lament. There would be no remedy similar to that found in II Chronicles 36:15-16 wherein it was written, And the LORD God of their fathers sent to them by his messengers, rising up betimes, and sending; because he had compassion on his people, and on his dwelling place: but they mocked the messengers of God, and despised his words, and misused his prophets, until the wrath of the LORD arose against his people, till there was no remedy. God then permitted Nebuchadnezzar to come and destroy the city and carry off the majority of its surviving inhabitants into exile in Babylonia for some 70 years. We are told in Ezekiel 10:18-19 that, the glory of the LORD departed from off the threshold of the house [the Temple], and stood over the cherubims. And the cherubims lifted up their wings, and mounted up from the earth in my sight... God removed his presence from the Temple much as in life, God removes his hand from a recalcitrant people so that evil will then be permitted to come and work its woes upon them.

Returning to our gospel lesson, our Lord prophesied concerning the coming destruction of Jerusalem and its people (St. Luke 19:42-44). Notice there is no room left for mercy or repentance. A debt had been incurred and the payment had to be made. Consider verse 42. If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! but now they are hid from thine eyes. Given all that had transpired during his earthly ministry, they should have known that he was the Christ and such would have been to their credit. How often did he reveal to them his divine nature via signs and wonders? Did he not heal the sick, raise the dead and teach what was true? Did he not heal a man born blind and cause the palsied to walk? How often had he proclaimed the truth of God to them and their hearts did not receive it?

And so, on account of their unbelief, they forfeited God's peace. When people reject Christ they are refusing God's offering of salvation—which costs them nothing but is of inestimable value. They will also forfeit his deliverance from the power of the evil one. When people reject Christ, they have no place in God's eternal kingdom. They have turned away from the great love and care which the Father has extended to us in his name. When people reject Christ, they remain in their sins and trespasses and are fit only to be cast into perdition by a just and holy God. When a people reject Christ, God will hide his blessings from them and their foolish hearts will be darkened. Our Lord then went on to explain the particulars of what would happen to the city and its people on account of their rejection of him as their Messiah. For the days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side (v. 43). The coming siege of Jerusalem was as described. Titus and his legions came and invested the city so that no one could enter or leave. The Romans were a methodical people and especially in warfare. They were well-versed in the mechanics of capturing a well-fortified city, and their soldiers were well-trained in just what to do once the walls were breached.

And they shall lay thee even with the ground, and thy children within thee; and they shall not leave in thee one stone upon another; because thou knewest not the time of thy visitation (v. 44). In St. Matthew's gospel (23:38), our Lord said, Behold, your house is left unto you desolate. And in St. Mark's (13:2) he reminded his disciples of Jerusalem's coming destruction when he said, Seest thou these great buildings? there shall not be left one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down. St. Luke also includes these words in a later chapter (21:6) which like St. Matthew's gospel (24:2) are referred to as the Olivet Discourse.

What our Lord presents to us is judgment. Without his divine hand, destruction will come. When the children of Israel turned away from God to worship the false gods of the Canaanites, God took away his hand of protection and their enemies dominated them. When their kings did that which was evil in the sight of the LORD, he removed his hedge of protection and they were plundered and carried away into exile. Why then would the people's rejection of their Christ result in an outcome different from those in their past?

Many of you know St. John 3:16, *For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.* These are wonderful and comforting words which have sustained many a Christian. But the three verses that follow are often overlooked. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through him might be saved. He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.

Condemnation follows unbelief and rejection. God is the Creator of all things. God's laws govern every aspect of the creation. God's will cannot be hindered, neither can his ways be found out apart from his impartation of such information to man via the prophets of old, or that of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and the work of the apostles under the guidance of the Holy Ghost. If men will not hear Moses and the prophets; if they will not hear the words of our Lord in the gospels; if they will not hear the instructions of the apostles in their epistles, then nothing but condemnation awaits such persons. The darkness of a life filled with sin and its enjoyment resists the light of truth that calls to the sinner, come out from among them and be thou separate (II Corinthians 6:17). God has called out to all humanity via Moses and the prophets, our Lord and the apostles. If we will accept his calling to turn unto him and be saved then the blessings of God will shower upon us. But if we reject him, then we will suffer the consequences.

Today, God is calling all persons to himself. It does not matter what you have done in your past. It does not matter if you have been recalcitrant in your Christianity. What matters is that you turn from your wickedness and live. Embrace the Lord Jesus as your Saviour and accept his free gift of grace. Renounce the devil and all his works and turn from them seeking God's forgiveness in the name of his only begotten Son, and then accept his healing and guiding hand via the Holy Ghost. The majority of the people in Judea and Jerusalem refused God's offer of grace and perished because of that choice. God does not bless the behavior of the unregenerate. God's peace is for them who love him and who are in Christ Jesus and walk not according to the flesh. Purpose in your heart today to come and be forgiven of God and redeemed for his kingdom and be not like those of our Lord's day who did not recognize the time of their visitation and were destroyed.

Let us pray,

GRACIOUS Father, pour into our hearts the desire to please thee in all our doings; that having accepted your free gift, we might ever live as a people redeemed from sin and death, and regenerated to a new life by the power of thy most holy Spirit; and these things we ask in the name of him who is the author and finisher of our faith, even Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
