*Screwtape strategizes with Wormwood*, *using Time as a weapon*:

# **Propers**

Each Sunday there are Propers: special prayers and readings from the Bible. There is a Collect for the Day; that is a single thought prayer, most written either before the refounding of the Church of England in the 1540s or written by Bishop Thomas Cranmer, the first Archbishop of Canterbury after the re-founding.

The Collect for the Day is to be read on Sunday and during Morning and Evening Prayer until the next Sunday. The Epistle is normally a reading from one of the various Epistles, or letters, in the New Testament. The Gospel is a reading from one of the Holy Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The Collect is said by the minister as a prayer, the Epistle can be read by either a designated reader (as we do in our church) or by one of the ministers and the Holy Gospel, which during the service in our church is read by an ordained minister.

The propers are the same each year, except if a Red Letter Feast, that is one with propers in the prayerbook, falls on a Sunday, then those propers are to be read instead, except in a White Season, where it is put off. Red Letter Feasts, so called because in the Altar Prayerbooks the titles are in red, are special days. Most of the Red Letter Feasts are dedicated to early saints instrumental in the development of the church, others to special events. Some days are particularly special and the Collect for that day is to be used for an octave (eight days) or an entire season, like Advent or Lent.

The Propers for today are found on Page 204-205, with the Collect first:

# The Eleventh Sunday after Trinity.

*The Collect.* 

**GOD**, who declarest thy almighty power chiefly in showing mercy and pity; Mercifully grant unto us such a measure of thy grace, that we, running the way of thy commandments, may obtain thy gracious promises, and be made partakers of thy heavenly treasure; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

The Epistle came from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, the Fifteenth Chapter beginning at the First Verse. Paul tells us he is delivering the message he received, the Good News of the Saving Grace of God through Jesus. He points out that if he, who had been Saul the Persecutor of Christ's Church here on earth could be saved by the Grace of God, then salvation was open to all who would act on their wishes. Thus all who believe on the Name of the Lord Jesus will be saved, if they do not depart from that course.

He recounts the death and resurrection of Jesus; noting the various witnesses to the resurrection, including himself. He goes on to say, if he, who he categorizes as the least of the apostles, not even meet to be called an apostle due to his persecution of the Church of God, can be forgiven and work the Work of God, who cannot?

Brethern, I declare unto you the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; by which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in vain. For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures: and that he was seen of Cephas, then of the twelve: after that, he was seen of above five hundred brethren at once; of whom the greater part remain unto this present, but some are fallen asleep. After that, he was seen of James; then of all the apostles. And last of all he was seen of me also, as of one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, that am not meet to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me. Therefore whether it were I or they, so we preach, and so ye believed."

Today's Holy Gospel started in the Eighteenth Chapter of the Gospel according to St. Luke, beginning at the Ninth Verse. Jesus tells a parable to an audience which apparently consisted of some self-righteous people, which likely fits each of us. The parable is that of a Pharisee<sup>2</sup> and a publican<sup>3</sup> both of whom pray in the temple. While

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Publican 1. (Rom. Antiq.) A farmer of the taxes and public revenues; hence, a collector of toll or tribute. The inferior officers of this class were often oppressive in their exactions, and were regarded with great detestation.

Literally a Publican is one who farmed the taxes (e. g., Zacchaeus, Luke 19: 2) to be levied from a town or district, and thus undertook to pay to the supreme government a certain amount. In order to collect the taxes, the publicans employed subordinates (5: 27; 15: 1; 18: 10), who, for their own ends, were often

the Pharisee might well have been a "better" man than the publican, he clearly was not the man he thought he was, for he "prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. The publican, quite aware of how much he fell shot of God's perfection stood "afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner." Jesus told his audience, "this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted." None of us is truly good, we can only strive to be better and look to our Lord to help us. Only through Christ will we be accounted as just before God.

# The Eleventh Sunday after Trinity.

*The Collect.* 

GOD, who declarest thy almighty power chiefly in showing mercy and pity; Mercifully grant unto us such a measure of thy grace, that we, running the way of thy commandments, may obtain thy gracious promises, and be made partakers of thy heavenly treasure; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

As revealed in our Prayer of Collect today, God's greater virtue and power is demonstrated in His miraculous power to forgive our sins of rebellion and omission. Whatever grace we have is an endowment of grace from God that enables us to keep His Commandments and be accounted righteous by the blood of Jesus Christ. It is thus that we may, with Abraham, attain to the promises made available through the Lord

guilty of extortion and peculation (defrauding the public by appropriating to one's own use the money or goods intrusted to one's care for management or disbursement; embezzlement). In New Testament times these taxes were paid to the Romans, and hence were regarded by the Jews as a very heavy burden, and hence also the collectors of taxes, who were frequently Jews, were hated, and were usually spoken of in very opprobrious terms. Jesus was accused of being a "friend of publicans and sinners" (Luke 7: 34).

Jesus Christ, and to share, with Him, in the blessed treasures of Heaven. This Collect is unique in specific aspects as are each of the Collects. I wrote a series of devotions a few years back on that uniqueness of each of the daily Collects - their origins and relevance to the Church Calendar, and to our lives. They are gifts to us of the early church fathers, many of whom gave their lives in fidelity to the Word of God.

In the Epistle from 1 Corinthians 15, Paul lays out the means and way of salvation through Christ alone. He, too, had been a Pharisee as we see in the Gospel account today whom Jesus addressed "certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others." (Luke 18:9) In fact, Paul (as Saul) had been a tool of the Pharisees by which many Christian worshippers had been persecuted and murdered. This is the context for the Words of Christ today from the Gospel of St. Luke 18:

9 And he spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: 10 Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. 11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. 12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess. 13 And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner. 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted. (Luke 18:9-14)

First of all, we note Jesus addressing His remarks to certain men present. Who were these men? Some are in church today. His words were addressed to certain men and women who believed in their OWN righteousness - even to the extent of condemning others and looking down on them. We would call that self-righteousness (and there is no such thing under Heaven). Such would be wise to heed the counsel of Paul to Timothy: Charge them that are rich in this world, that they be not highminded, nor trust in uncertain riches, but in the living God, who giveth us richly all things to enjoy; That they do good, that they be rich in good works, ready to distribute, willing to communicate; Laying up in store for themselves a good foundation against the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life. (1 Tim 6:17-19)

Secondly, our Lord is speaking of two DIFFERENT kinds of people (a Pharisee and a Publican) - BOTH went up for the seemingly same purpose (to pray). BOTH went to the right place for prayer - the House of the Lord. But the similarities end with those two facts. Let us examine, now, wherein the characteristics of these two men diverge, and examine our own hearts to learn if we are like unto one or the other of the two:

#### The Pharisee

# 1) The Pharisee's ATTITUDE of Prayer:

- a. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself. Intimated herein is that the Pharisee stood proudly, and he prayed out of a false perspective. He did not humbly pray to God, but prayed thus with himself. His words were not directed to God, truly, but for his own personal purposes which are explained further in the text. He trusted that he was righteous just as millions of Christians do every Sunday at worship. Smug and arrogantly they sit in the pew thinking of those others when the word 'sinner' is mentioned. They trust too much in their OWN religion and not upon the imputed righteousness of Christ.
- b. They trust too much in a particular denomination and not the sole grace of God and the sacrifice of His Son.
- c. They feel like they are not "like those others."

- a. We read of how proudly the Pharisee prayed "with himself" not to God. He prayed that others might hear his boastful words. The contrary is true of the publican who felt himself unworthy to come so near the Temple. He did not lay claim to ANY GOODNESS, or righteous deeds, in his life but only sought mercy upon himself as a sinner.
- 2) <u>The Pharisee's PRESUMPTION in Prayer</u>: He did not begin by glorifying God, or showing a spirit of repentance for sins he, like us, had surely committed. But, if taken alone, his prayer would have been more fitting than it became when he added his reason for gratitude to God. " *God, I thank thee*." The Pharisee would have been better off to stop right there with that salutation! But he did not!
- 3) The Pharisee's ARROGANCE of Prayer: For what was the Pharisee thankful?
  - a. The Pharisee boasts of being thankful for what he is not!
    - i. "I AM NOT as other men are" In other words, "I am better than all others. I am good in, and of, myself."
    - ii. I am not an "extortioner" "I have never been guilty of such a sin" (but probably was stained badly thereby)
    - iii. I am not "*unjust*" He is being unjust on the face of his proclamation and his indictment of the publican!
    - iv. I am not an "adulterer" He may have been one of those guilty Pharisees who brought the Woman taken in Adultery to Christ who left early because of his guilt.
    - v. I am not "even as this publican." In other words, "I am not a COMMON sinner<sup>4</sup> as is this publican!"
  - b. The Pharisee boasts of being thankful for what he DOES!
    - i. "I fast twice in the week"
    - ii. "I give tithes of all that I possess"
  - c. In TRUTH, the Pharisee was none of what he claimed as his own:
    - i. In truth: He was a liar! Though he claimed otherwise, he was precisely as other men are a sinner. (Romans 3:23)
    - ii. He was an extortioner. (Matthew 23:14, Mark 12:40)
    - iii. He was unjust. His very attitude and self-opinion of himself proved this.
    - iv. He was a worse man than the publican for the publican realized his need to which the Pharisee was blinded of his own.
    - v. He did not fast to satisfy a Godly purpose but only for the purpose of show and boasting.
    - vi. He did not tithe of all he had for he kept his heart from God by not surrendering it to Him. (Luke 20:25)
    - vii. He had a religious zeal, but not according to the Bible. "....they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God. (Romans 10:2-3) Now let us look at the Publican: "And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner."

#### The Publicans

- 1) The publican knew who he was a lost sinner and condemned.
- 2) The publican knew his place with God without mercy at a distance!
- 3) The publican knew how he felt guilty, ashamed and needing mercy.
- 4) He knew WHAT he needed MERCY.
- 5) He knew how to attain mercy repent, confess, and call upon the Lord.
- 6) He knew of his salvation went down to his house justified.

There is a great secret revealed, too, in this Parable – sin causes a great separation from man and God. The only means to bridge that separation is repentance and confession of sins. When we have betrayed or hurt a close friend, do we not avoid looking them in the eye until we have reconciled ourselves to that friend? We may not speak to that friend for months due to our guilt. The friend may not even be aware of our guilt, BUT WE ARE! When we forget God, we live according to our own prerogatives. This free will always leads to sin. That sin raises a wall between us and God. Suddenly, we are ashamed as was Adam in the Garden. We cannot tear down that wall with our good deeds, but only by our tearful cries for mercy!

Do we mark our offering envelopes at church with large letters to show our great tithing? Do we embellish our prayers with beautiful words that do not come from the heart, but from a proud mind? Do we attempt to seem so close to God that publicans cannot approach Him? Do we admit our unworthiness apart from God's grace? Have we known that the very moment we feel that we are "good enough" is the very moment that we are NOT? Do not be a pharisaical hypocrite, but be a humble sinner who lays claim to grace and mercy in God.

Which of the two are we most alike - the Pharisee, or the Publican?

Better be a lowly Publican than a proud Pharisee! AMEN!

Sermon – Reverend Jack Arnold - Time and Action Church of the Faithful Centurion - Descanso, California

Today's sermon tied the Collect, Epistle and Gospel together and talked, as is oft the case, of the need for action, not simply diction.



Consider the words from the Collect, wherein we ask God ... who declarest thy almighty power chiefly in showing mercy and pity; Mercifully grant unto us such a measure of thy grace, that we, running the way of thy commandments, may obtain thy gracious promises, and be made partakers of thy heavenly treasure; ...

Once again, this Collect is kind of a follow-on to the last few weeks' Collects. First, we acknowledge God's power which is manifested not in terror but in mercy and pity on our failures. This is important to note; with all the power

in and of the universe, God chooses to manifest His Power in showing infinite mercy and kindness to us, not in causing us more tears. He is far kinder to us than we could ever possibly deserve. We would expect Him to be otherwise, given our fallen nature.

Rather than be unforgiving and unmerciful, He is there to comfort and help us. He does not act as a human would in His position, but rather being a merciful and mindful God to us. He realizes our struggles and gives us resources to us to help with those struggles. Thus, the Collect goes on to ask His Help in following His Commandments that we might gain the good that comes from that following. And we would hope that we recognize the good that comes from that following and choose to repeat doing the following as opposed to going astray such as our tendency is.

As imperfect creatures of free will, the norm is to choose what we want, not what we need, then we come to calamity. We are each grievous sinners, some worse than others, none better. Yet, we come before God all equal. In equally big trouble, some more, none less. We are all equal by the fact that we are hopeless sinners without the saving grace and faith of Christ. It is only through faith we are saved. And not our faith, but the faith of Christ that dwells within us.

This is the point Saint Paul is making when he says that first he gave unto us<sup>6</sup> that understanding he got directly from God as to the role of Jesus Christ. He recounts some of the factual information about Jesus' time here on earth after the crucifixion, the descent into hell and the resurrection. He is confirming that the story of the Gospel as told to him. He notes the various witnesses, still alive or recently passed away. He makes the point that we must spread the gospel so that others might believe. He tells us we are saved by faith alone.

Our faith? Partly, but not chiefly and not first. Then whose faith is it that we are saved by?

We are saved by the perfect faith of Christ, our only mediator and advocate before the Father. It is not by our faith, but the faith of Him who dwells within us, that of Chirst. Without Christ, we could not have any faith to begin with. The perfect faith of Christ allowed a single sacrifice to be made at one time, to right the account the sins of all mankind for all time. This is the faith that saves us and our faith in Him allows Him to operate in us. If we do not have faith in Him, He cannot enter into us with His faith. That is why those who do not have the Holy Ghost in them do not believe in Him. One of Paul's points in today's Epistle was that if he, the previous Chief Persecutor of the church could be saved by Jesus' that option was available to each of us. Anybody who is able and willing to can be saved by Jesus. They just need to repent and turn back to Him. All we need to do is repent and follow. Thus, we need to Lead, Follow or Get out of the Way towards Christ and God's grace.

The other point is that Jesus is real, He is Who He says He IS. He is not a fictional character, he is not a great teacher. He is THE SON OF GOD and He came to save us: body, heart, mind and soul. There is no other way to view Him that makes as perfect sense as this. Just as we are real sinners, He is a real Savior. You cannot have the Holy Spirit within you and say that He is not the Son of God. Likewise, you cannot say He is the Son of God without the Holy Ghost in you.

If that is not enough to turn your heart, consider the parable of the publican and the Pharisee related by Saint Luke. The man who was proud of his performance was not the example Jesus chose for the one justified, rather the one who acknowledged his failures and asked God for forgiveness and help. Think of these examples and who

would we rather be like, the publican, or the Pharisee? Remember, the Pharisee's job consisted of finding clever ways around the 613 Mosaic Laws. The publican was looking for help in actually following two:

Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ saith.

THOU shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets. BCP Page 69

And, just as importantly, he was not looking for ways around those two laws, he was looking for help to follow God and forgiveness when he fell short.

Let us ask God for the help we need to follow His Will. For we must have His Help to act as we must here on earth!

Action counts. For by their actions ye shall know them.



Before we try to answer this question, let's talk about what it means to be under the law of God. In its most basic sense, being under the law means to be required to keep the moral law as it is summarised in the Ten Commandments, and in the admonition of Christ to love God "with all thy heart and with all thy soul and with all thy mind," and to "love thy neighbour as thyself." In this sense, we are all under the law because its standards and demands are true goodness, and will never pass away. Idolatry, theft, adultery, and murder will always be wrong. Godliness, honesty, sexual purity, and respect for life will always be right, forever.

In another sense we are all under the law because we are all transgressors of it. The well known words, "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23) are part of the conclusion of a long passage that shows that people who have never heard the Gospel and never read the Bible, are without excuse for their sins because God is revealed in nature, and because at least part of the truth of God is known by them. But they hold the truth in unrighteousness (Rom. 1:18). They suppress the truth they have about God, and they make up gods according to their own likings and preferences. Then they live in accordance with the ways of their idols, instead of in accordance with the ways of God. This means that, even though some people don't have or know the full revelation of God given in the Bible, all have some revelation of God and His will. Their problem is not that they don't have the full revelation. Their problem is that they don't live according to the revelation they have. Those who have the Bible, are also transgressors of the law of God. We have it, we know it, but we don't obey it fully and joyfully as we should. So, all have sinned and come short of the glory of God.

In yet another sense, we are all under the law because we are all condemned by it. Whether we understand it or not, or agree with it or not, or like it or not, we are without excuse before God because we have all failed to obey the light we have. SI want to say again, some people don't have the Bible, but they have some knowledge of good and evil, and they fail to live up to that knowledge. Some do not believe the Bible, but they still have some standards, and they also fail to live up to their own standards. Some have the Bible, and earnestly try to live by its teachings and standards, but they also fail. Thus we are all living proof of Romans 3:23, "all have sinned." Just as darkness has no fellowship with light, and ungodliness has no fellowship with Godliness, God, who is perfect goodness, has no fellowship with evil. It is the very antithesis of His Being. Sin is evil, therefore God has no fellowship with it, and, by definition, He has no fellowship with those who commit it. Just the opposite; He is angry at sinners. He hates sin. Those who commit sin are under His wrath. As another well known verse of Romans puts it, "the wages of sin is death" (Rom 6:23).

Now let's talk about what it means to be under grace. In order to understand this, we need to know what grace is. Grace is God's decision to do good to us, in spite of our sins and unworthiness. The wages of sin is death, meaning the second death, which is the lake of fire forever. Everything God does, short of throwing us into the lake of fire and brimstone, is grace. When you think of it this way, even the troubles and catastrophes of life are part of God's grace. If a tornado destroys a person's home, he is still enjoying God's grace because he is not suffering in hell for his sins. If debilitating illness strikes a person, he is still enjoying God's grace because he is not suffering in hell for his sins. If a person is a drug addict, or an alcoholic, or on skid row, or on death row, he is still enjoying the grace of God because he is not suffering for his sins in hell. If you are not a drug addict, if you are not an alcoholic, if you are not a criminal, if you are not on skid Row or death row, it is only because the grace of God has kept you from falling into these sins and situations. The saying, "there but for the grace of God go I," is absolutely true. If you are a Christian it is only because of the grace of God, who has enabled you to hear and believe the Gospel. If you make it to Heaven, it will be only because the grace of God keeps you from falling away from the faith. It will not be because the tenacity and strength of your faith keeps you hanging onto God; it will be because God holds you in His Almighty Hand, and nothing is able to pluck you out of it.

Usually, when we think of grace, we think of what God has done in Christ to forgive our sins, and to restore us to fellowship with Him, and to give us a home in Heaven To be under grace means to be the beneficiaries of the forgiveness and restoration God has accomplished for His people in Christ. It means that we do not stand before God under the law, which, as we have already seen, condemns us. We stand before God under grace, which accepts us through Christ's work, and treats us as though we have not sinned. Under grace, God takes guilty sinners' sins upon Himself and dies for them on the cross. Under grace God's Holy Spirit allows guilty sinners to hear the Gospel of Christ, calls us to believe the Gospel, and even enables us to believe the Gospel and trust in Christ. So, God effects our forgiveness by paying for our sins on the cross. God applies the results of Christ's death to us by enabling us to hear and believe the Gospel by faith. God receives those who have this faith, as though we had never sinned. Those to whom God effects forgiveness by the sacrifice of Christ; applies forgiveness by enabling us to hear and believe the Gospel, and receives as though we had never sinned, are now under grace, and remain under grace, forever. We will never be under law again. We will never fall back into condemnation because of our

What I have just briefly described is wonderful beyond words. We won't really be able to appreciate what this means to us until we stand in Heaven and see the glory of God with our own eyes, and know the joy and peace of God in the fullest sense. Until then we see in part and know in part. What we see and know is wonderful, but still only partial. In Heaven we will know as we are known. If the partial knowledge we now have produces joy and peace in us, think what the full knowledge will do in us. But there is still more to being under grace. Under grace, God remakes us in the inward person. He reforms your nature, your character, your personality, your soul. In other words, whatever it is that makes you you, and whatever it is that forms your values and choices and attitudes and personality is rebuilt by God, so that you become what the Bible refers to as transformed, a new creature, or, raised to new life in Christ. In its simplest terms, God transforms you from living for yourself to living for God. He turns you from a person who demands that God love and accept you on your terms, to a person who loves and accepts God on God's terms.

Now we come to the question of how all of this applies to how we will fare on the Day of Judgment, since we are not perfect and none of us fully loves or obeys God. I stress here that the transformation of our being is a life long process. It is often painful, and it is never completed while we are here on earth. And it is sometimes difficult to tell who is a true believer, and who is an unbeliever. This is because it is possible for an unbeliever to act and talk like a true believer, and because true believers often fall and sin, and act like unbelievers. We don't have a soul MRI that enables us to tell one from the other, but you can tell which one you are, because a true believer follows a course of life that genuinely seeks to grow closer to God and obey Him more completely. An unbeliever may be good and religious, but the course of his life is different. The true believer's spiritual compass is set on God, and he moves consistently toward that point. Yes, he veers and strays off course sometimes, but his general direction is toward God. The unbeliever's compass is set on something else. That something else may be very similar to God, in the same way magnetic north is very similar to true north, but his compass is not set on God. Therefore his progress is not toward God, and God is not his intended destination.

One thing we can say is that the true believer does not obey God's commandments out of mere duty, fear, or a sense of morality that tells him this is the way a person ought to live. He obeys God because he loves God. He does the things God loves because he loves them too. He pursues Godliness because he, himself is Godly. He has been made new. The transformation I spoke of a few moments ago, has happened to him. He is a new creature, and he must live according to the nature of the new creature. George Gershwin wrote, "Fish gotta swim, birds gotta fly." We may well add, Christians gotta live Godly lives. We live in accordance with who and what we are.

Let me close with this important point; how will failures and sins affect true believers on Judgement Day? Will we be punished? Will our Heavenly rewards be diminished? Instead of a mansion in glory will we get a shanty in some Heavenly slum? While there is much we don't know about what God is going to do on Judgment Day, or how He is going to do it, we do know that those who are under grace will always be under grace. I believe our sins will be reviewed, but not punished. The review will reinforce to us that we have sinned and come short of the glory of God. It will show us how far short we fell, and how often. And it will show again the great glory and mercy of God who redeemed us by bearing our sins in Christ. We will be shown that we deserve hell, and this fact will be graphically and undeniably imprinted on our beings. But we will be given Heaven, in all of its glory, Nothing will be withheld from us. Everything God is and has will be ours to enjoy forever.

# Rev Bryan Dabney of Saint John's Sunday Sermon

We are fortunate to have Bryan's Sunday Sermon. If you want people to come to The Truth, you have to speak the truth, expouse the truth and live the truth. This is really a good piece and I commend it to your careful reading.

# **Eleventh Sunday after Trinity**

Do you feel justified in your faith? As a Christian, you ought to because our Lord has paid the price for your sins so that you need only confess them in his name to the Father to be cleansed of them. Our justification then comes solely via our faith in Christ. Still, there are those who believe that you have to work to be saved and that following the Law— even in a selective understanding of its principles— is required of all who would be made acceptable to God. No my friends, we are not saved by keeping the Law and let me explain why. Awhile back, I saw a chart detailing the differences between the Law of Moses and the Grace of God via Jesus Christ. This chart was taken from a tract entitled Law vs. Grace by George and Donna Brady and Steve Roberts. The items were arranged in a columnar format with the points regarding the Law on one side and those for Grace on the other. Each item was written in clear and concise language making it an effective teaching tool for both gospel preachers and Christian educators. Consider the following selected points:

Law Came through Moses.

Grace Came through Jesus Christ. For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ (St. John 1:17).

Law Requires perfect performance.

Grace Based on Christ's performance. For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all (St. James 2:10). For if by one's man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ (Romans 5:17).

Law Kills.

Grace Gives life.... for the letter [of the law] killeth, but the spirit giveth life (II Corinthians 3:6). Law: shuts every mouth before God. Grace: Opens every mouth to praise God. Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may be guilty before God (Romans 3:20b). But by [Jesus Christ] therefore let us offer the sacrifices of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to his name (Hebrews 13:15).

Law Put a great distance between God and man.

Grace Reconciles us to God. Therefore the LORD God sent [Adam] forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken (Genesis 3:23). Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature... And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ... (II Corinthians 5:17-19).

Law Written on stone. Grace: written on our hearts. And [the LORD] declared unto you his covenant, which he commanded you to perform, even the Ten Commandments; and he wrote them upon two tables of stone (Deuteronomy 4:13). Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshly tables of the heart (II Corinthians 3:3).

Law Not based on faith.

Grace Through faith. The law is not of faith: but, The man that doeth them shall live in them (Galatians 3:12). For by grace ye are saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is a gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Law Does not justify.

Grace Justifies us. Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ (Galatians 2:16a).

Law Has an end.

Grace Has no end. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth (Romans 10:4).

*The Articles of Religion* (BCP pp. 603-611) cover much of what has been discussed. Article XI states in part:

We are accounted righteous before God, only for the merit of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ by faith and not for our own works or deservings.

In actuality, our sinful natures have rendered us powerless to stand and justify

ourselves before a righteous and holy God. As St. Paul noted in his epistle to the Romans: As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one... Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God... But now the righteousness of God without the law is manifested... by faith... being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. .. (3:10-25). And in today's epistle we find the following: Who shall lay any thing to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifieth. Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us (Romans 8:33-34). Without a doubt, our Reformation and Anglican fathers embraced the concepts of "justification by faith alone, in Christ alone" based upon these and other passages of Scripture.

Consider also the words of the apostle John who noted in his first epistle that whosoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith... Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God? This is he that came by water and the blood... And it is the Spirit that beareth witness, because the Spirit is truth... If we receive the witness of men, the witness of God is greater: for this is the witness of God which he hath testified of his Son. He that believeth on the Son of God hath the witness in himself... And this is the record that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in his Son (5:4-12). We are therefore justified by the atoning work of our Lord Jesus Christ. And as we have received Christ, so too do we receive the Comforter who witnesses to us that we are in fact heirs with Christ in his glory (Romans 8:16-17). Our justification to God then is based not on any works we might do, but is entirely based upon the one oblation of our Lord who shed his blood to wash away our sins.

The law was a works-based system God gave to the children of Israel as part of his covenant relationship with them. St. Paul tells us in his epistle to the Galatians the law was added because of transgressions, till the seed should come to whom the promise was made. That seed was Jesus Christ who is our Mediator. Is the law then against the promises of God? God forbid: for if there had been a law given which could have given life, verily righteousness should have been by the law. But the scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe. But before faith came, we were kept under the law, shut up unto the faith which should afterwards be revealed. Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster. For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus... and if ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise (3:19-29).

Some think that simply following what they term "The Big Ten" is all that they need to do to be made right with God. They may admit that Jesus is the Son of God, but they do not seem content to let him be their Redeemer. They look at their lives with a selective consciousness that highlights their so-called good deeds, while overlooking the very evil which dominates their existence. They believe that having done a few good things here and there will make them good people in the eyes of God. They have forgotten that they have sinned against God and are thus negligent in confessing those sins to the Father in the name of his only begotten Son. Sadly, many would rather pat themselves on the back for those things for which the world has applauded them in the false belief that they have been justified to God through them.

Please keep in mind God provided the law to remind us of our sinfulness. St. Paul

affirmed such in his first epistle to St. Timothy when he wrote: But we know that the law is good, if a man use it lawfully, knowing this, that the law is not made for a righteous man, but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and for sinners... and if there be any other thing that is contrary to sound doctrine (1:8-10).

Instead of seeking to justify ourselves, we ought to trust in him who justifies us through his own shed blood. God has provided the gift of redemption and reconciliation through his only begotten Son. His sacrifice has the power to wash away our sins and put us in good standing with God the Father. Sadly, many Christians do not possess such an understanding of this important tenet of our faith. The Devil would like nothing better than for each of us to abandon the biblical concept of justification and hop on his works-equal-salvation bandwagon. He has been hard at this game for a very long time, and he persists in its use because it has been a successful tactic. He would like nothing better than for as many Christians as possible to buy into his version of the Works Progress Administration so that he might get them to turn away from the truth of God's word.

# CS Lewis once penned an excellent example of the above in the <u>Screwtape</u> <u>Letters</u>:

The real trouble about the set your patient is living in is that it is merely Christian. They all have individual interests, of course, but the bond remains mere Christianity. What we want, if men become Christians at all, is to keep them in the state of mind I call Christianity And. You know— Christianity and the Crisis, Christianity and the New Psychology, Christianity and the New Order... If they must be Christians let them at least be Christians with a difference. Substitute for the faith itself some Fashion... Work on their horror of the Same Old Thing... [this] is one of the most valuable passions we have produced in the human heart— an endless source of heresies in religion, folly in counsel, infidelity in marriage and inconstancy in friendships.

Think about how the modernists have altered the Parable of the Net— as Rev. EM Bounds once noted— changing its dynamics so that their goal has become an effort to change the sea, not catch the good fish that are in it. And on this account, they have rejected the notion that there are good fish and bad fish in favor of saving every fish (Matthew 13:47-50). They have also developed a set of doctrines which they refer to quite disarmingly as "customs and traditions." But the mere fact that a set of practices and behaviors have been around for a long time hardly warrants their unqualified acceptance within any church. Even during the time of our Lord's earthly ministry, the Pharisees had their own man-made traditions which often ran counter to what he had taught. Thus it should not be surprising that these demonically inspired cadres and teachers — who have been ever mingled with the true worshippers over the millennia— have endorsed such religious practices and tenets which have the appearance of biblical truth, but do not match up with such in verbum.

Regenerated Christians beware! Accept nothing but the unvarnished word of God as written, and not as interpreted by those who have the hiss of the serpent under their breath. If God's word written has set forth the matter at hand, do not add to it or take away from it. Be a Berean. Search the Scriptures and compare, but do such in a prayerful manner. Pray for God's Spirit to guide you. Remember, we work because we have been saved. We work because we have already received God's free gift. And we

labor because we are justified by Christ: for it is through him and him alone that our works have any meaning.

Let us pray:

**GRACIOUS** Father, who has regenerated us via the working of the Holy Ghost; grant to us such a measure of thy Spirit that we, ever growing in thy love and service, will always give thee thanks for thy salvation through the blood of thine only begotten Son, Jesus Christ; and these we ask in his most blessed name. *Amen*.
