Today was Fathers Day, as well as The First Sunday after Sunday, the first real Green Sunday and the beginning of the Endless Green Season.

Fathers Day

Today is a day set aside to remember and pray for our fathers, those who are with us and those who have gone before us and brought us to this point in our lives.

Fathers Day is a day we celebrate the role of fathers in our lives. It is normally a day of joy and congratulations, maybe a little sadness as we remember those of our fathers who have gone before us. But, it is more than that, it is a reminder of what a father's role should be. Scripture puts the father at the head of the family, not as a dictator, but using Jesus for as an example, to give his all for his family; up to and including his earthly life if needed. Done right, it is not easy; not done right it is not acceptable. It is a special responsibility. A father is to be the spiritual head of the family, a provider of both spiritual and earthly needs, the protector, commander, president, judge and most of all - the leader. To lead, you must be ahead of those you lead. Lead means, follow me; not, head that way. A father must live his life for his family. The role comes with privileges, but the privileges are granted only to those who fulfill the responsibilities. Those responsibilities are awesome, but the rewards incredible. Yet, as a father, I assure you, in the words of Paul, we all fall short. But that does not mean we should give up, but rather we must redouble our efforts.

I share with you a poem in a Fathers Day card I received. I can tell you I have fallen short, but it is clear from the card what I must do in the coming year:

Propers

Each Sunday there are Propers: special prayers and readings from the Bible. There is a Collect for the Day; that is a single thought prayer, most written either before the re-founding of the Church of England in the 1540s or written by Bishop Thomas Cranmer, the first Archbishop of Canterbury after the re-founding.

The Collect for the Day is to be read on Sunday and during Morning and Evening Prayer until the next Sunday. The Epistle is normally a reading from one of the various Epistles, or letters, in the New Testament. The Gospel is a reading from one of the Holy Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The Collect is said by the minister as a prayer, the Epistle can be read by either a designated reader (as we do in our church) or by one of the ministers and the Holy Gospel, which during the service in our church is read by an ordained minister.

The propers are the same each year, except if a Red Letter Feast, that is one with propers in the prayerbook, falls on a Sunday, then those propers are to be read instead, except in a White Season, where it is put off. Red Letter Feasts, so called because in the Altar Prayerbooks the titles are in red, are special days. Most of the Red Letter Feasts are dedicated to early saints instrumental in the development of the church, others to special events. Some days are particularly special and the Collect for that day is to be used for an octave (eight days) or an entire season, like Advent or Lent.

The Propers for today are found on Page 188-190, with the Collect first:

First Sunday after Trinity.

The Collect.

O GOD, the strength of all those who put their trust in thee; Mercifully accept our prayers; and because, through the weakness of our mortal nature, we can do no good thing without thee, grant us the help of thy grace, that in keeping thy commandments we may please thee, both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Today’s Epistle came from St. John’s First General Epistle, the Fourth Chapter, beginning at the Seventh Verse. John pointed out that if we do not love our brethren here on earth we have seen and touched, how then can we claim to have love for God, whom no man hath seen? “Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love.”

God loved us so much He sent His only Son to die for our sins. That is true love. Not that we love Him, but that first He loved us! So, if God first loved us, ought we also not love each other? No one has seen God at any time. Yet, He loves us and we say we love Him. If we do love one another, then God is in us, the Holy Ghost, and we are in Him. Be bold, the world will end some time, for each of us it ends when we leave here. Fear not, trust in God and dread naught. God and His love will keep fear and the damage it does at bay. Love each other and act on that love.

This reading covers the same ground as Jesus' Summary of the Law, the second portion, "That he who loveth God love his brother also." God is love, not hate.

BELOVED, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love. In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only-begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another. No man hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us. Hereby know we that we dwell in him, and he in us, because he hath given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world. Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God dwelleth in him, and he in God. And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him. Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love. We love him, because he first loved us. If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen? And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also.

Today's Gospel came from the Sixteenth Chapter of the Gospel according to St. Luke, beginning at the Nineteenth Verse. It is a story Jesus told of Lazarus, not the Lazarus whom he raised from the dead, but a fictional character. This Lazarus was poor and very ill, he was laid at the gate of an extremely well fed rich man hoping he might be fed with the castoffs from the rich man's table. He was so ill, he could not move when dogs came to lick his sores. He died and went to heaven where he was well cared for and was whole. The rich man died, and for his self centered behavior here on earth, went to hell where he was tormented horribly. He looked up and saw Lazarus. He begged for just a touch of water, that he might be comforted. Abraham told the rich man that he would receive no comfort as he had partaken of all the comfort he would get while on earth when he thought only of himself. He also told him there was a gulf between heaven and hell through which no one could pass. Hearing that, the rich man asked that Lazarus be sent to his father's house that his brothers might avoid his fate. Abraham pointed out they had the words of Moses and the prophets, if they would not hear them, they would not listen to one who rose from the dead.

THERE was a certain rich man, which was clothed in purple and fine linen, and fared sumptuously every day: and there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, which was laid at his gate, full of sores, and desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table: moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; and in hell he lift up his eyes, being in

torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame. But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented. And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence. Then he said, I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house: for I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment. Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them. And he said, Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent. And he said unto him, If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead.

The Rich Man and Lazarus

Today's text is about two men of opposite character. In actuality, it is about three men – the Rich Man, Lazarus and Abraham. Only the names of two is mentioned – Abraham and Lazarus – because they are the only names of eternal worth transcribed in the Lamb's Book of Life. The Rich Man has no need of a name in Hell.

Though this parable (and perhaps a real event in reality) is meant for all of us, Jesus primarily aimed it at the rich and powerful preachers of His day who coveted MONEY. Do you believe any nature of man's heart has changed from that day to this! Jesus had just told a parable about another rich steward who used his money to satisfy mammon by sharing the wealth. The Pharisees stood about and jeered Him: *"¹⁴ And the Pharisees also, who were covetous, heard all these things: and they derided him."* Luke 16:14 So Jesus related this parable. How many churches can you enter today without hearing an over-abundant plea for MONEY?

The Holy Bible has much to say about riches, and Jesus Christ, who is the Word Incarnate, adds to the volume of commentary on riches:

Matthew 6:19-21

Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: ²⁰ But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: ²¹ For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

Proverbs 30:8

⁸ Remove far from me vanity and lies: give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with food convenient for me: ⁹ Lest I be full, and deny thee, and say, Who is the LORD? or lest I be poor, and steal, and take the name of my God in vain.

Matthew 19:23-26 (After Rich Young Ruler):

*Verily I say unto you, That a rich man shall hardly enter into the kingdom of heaven. ²⁴ And again I say unto you, It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God. ²⁵ When his disciples heard it, they were exceedingly amazed, saying, Who then can be saved? ²⁶ But Jesus beheld them, and said unto them, *With men this is impossible; but with God all things are possible.**

In describing another rich man, Christ refers to Zaccheus: *And Jesus entered and passed through Jericho. ² And, behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus, which was the chief among the publicans, and he was rich.* Luke 19:1-2 But Zaccheus also was saved in his riches while Dives (the Rich man in today's text) was condemned.

Our Sermon text for today comes from the 16th chapter of the Gospel of St Luke, beginning at the 16th verse, giving us a picture of the reward of those who consider only riches of worth, and a poor beggar who places his trust in God alone; however, the chapter begins with another rich man:

Luke 16:1

¹ And he said also unto his disciples, There was a certain rich man, which had a steward; and the same was accused unto him that he had wasted his goods.

The sermon text:

T*H***ERE** *was a certain rich man, which was clothed in purple and fine linen, and fared sumptuously every day: ²⁰ And there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, which was laid at his gate, full of sores, ²¹ And desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table: moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. ²² And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; ²³ And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. ²⁴ And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame. ²⁵ But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivest thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented. ²⁶ And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence. ²⁷ Then he said, I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house: ²⁸ For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment. ²⁹ Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them. ³⁰ And he said, Nay, father Abraham:*

but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent. ³¹ *And he said unto him, If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead.* (Luke 19:16)

Christ paints for us a real life scene of two different lifestyles – both on the same canvas:

1. He first sketches the contrast between Dives and Lazarus in life, a contrast the more impressive because the painter does not bring his two figures together from the opposite ends of the earth, or even from east and west of the same city only. Lazarus gasping in the shadow of the gateway, and the purple drapery of Dives moving behind the blossom and leafage of the courtyard in the hall beyond, might have been seen by the passer-by from the same point of view; so it is no outburst of eccentric idealism that leads the painter to put two such figures on one canvas.
2. Christ now paints another contrast, a contrast dealing not with the things that are seen and temporal, but with the things that are unseen and eternal. The contrast is resumed beyond the grave, but the figures are transposed. The next world has its contrasts as well as this.
3. A contrast of character underlies this picture. Little is told us of the beggar beyond the contrast in character implied in the name chosen to describe him; Lazarus or 'God my helper'. The rich man's life was turned away from God, and turned towards himself; the beggar's was turned away from himself and turned towards God.

Note the truths illustrated herein:

1. A common experience awaits all – rich and poor – the experience of death!
2. When death takes us from this life, we carry no riches or acclaim.
3. A difference in destinies await the a) lost and b) those who trust in God.
4. Our Names (or identities) are only important in God.
5. There is a difference in honor and love of those who die in Christ
6. We all are aware of our conditions in the afterlife.
7. Those in heaven cannot see Hell.
8. Those in Hell can see Heaven
9. There can be no conveyance between Heaven and Hell.
10. If we believe not the full counsel of God, we cannot come to God.

What lesson do we learn from this Parable of our Lord?

- a) What seems most valuable in this life may be the least valuable, or of no value at all.
- b) We must love one another: Matthew 22:36-39 – *Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.* ³⁸ *This is the first and great commandment.* ³⁹ *And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.* ⁴⁰ *On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.*

John 13: ³⁴ *A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.* ³⁵ *By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.*

- c) We can take no riches from this world.
- d) we must deposit our riches in love, obedience, and Godliness in God's Bank.
- e) We must make our salvation certain while life remains. John 6: ¹ *We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain.* ² *(For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)*
- f) Miracles are not what convinces: "...though one return from the dead..."
- g) Failure to decide this day and hour, we may be lost as the rich man and find our graves in hell.

Matthew 11

²⁸ *Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.* ²⁹ *Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.* ³⁰ *For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.*

When? NOW!

Why? REST!

What? Eternal Life! John 6:53 – Our Holy Communion in Art:

Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you. ⁵⁴ *Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day.* ⁵⁵ *For my flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed.* ⁵⁶ *He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, dwelleth in me, and I in him.* ⁵⁷ *As the living Father hath sent me, and I live by the Father: so he that eateth me, even he shall live by me.* ⁵⁸ *This is that bread which came down from heaven: not as your fathers did eat manna, and are dead: he that eateth of this bread shall live for ever.* ⁵⁹ *These things said he in the synagogue, as he taught in Capernaum.*

Whose bread do you eat? The Bread of Heaven, or the molded and decayed bread the world offers?

Now is the Time....AMEN!

Sermon – Reverend Jack Arnold - Time and Action

Today's sermon brought the Collect, Epistle and Gospel together and is partly contained in the forewords above.



Consider these words from the Collect:

... the strength of all those who put their trust in thee; ... through the weakness of our mortal nature, we can do no good thing without thee, grant us the help of thy grace, that in keeping thy commandments we may please thee, both in will and deed...

This is a little longer Collect than usual, but in it we acknowledge that God is the source of our strength, as we are weak and cannot do any true good without His Help; thus, we ask His help or grace to do His Will in both in our thoughts and actions. This is a very consistent theme through all the collects, because it is based on the simple truth we cannot help ourselves and we need true Divine Guidance in order to make it into heaven. We need His Guidance to perform the actions we need to follow the course that Jesus has set for us.

And, what is the first action we are to take? To love one another. Saint John pointed out if we do not love our fellow creatures here on earth whom we have seen and touched, how then can we claim to have love for God, whom not one of us have seen? We then cannot love God if we cannot love our fellow humans, no matter how far they have strayed from His path, we are still to love them and offer them help and help others. Jesus came to serve, as the ultimate Servant, so must we be also. Even though He is the King, He has chosen to be a humble King, one who puts His Flock before His Own live. He embodies the model we must truly follow if we are to call ourselves Christians. We cannot truly be Christians if we are not following in His Example of selflessness.

We must to truly love individuals. For many of us, the first step is to stop hating them, for if love is the epitome of good, hate is the nadir of evil. Hate is a truly bad thing for us, it is all consuming and all destroying. First, stop hating, hate no person. No one is evil enough to justify your hating them. There are many people whose removal from this world would be a benefit to the world, that does not mean you should hate them. Hating does not produce any positive effects to help God's cause here on Earth. It rather detracts from His Cause. It is like a slow acting poison consuming your mind until you are no longer following Him. You can feel sad for them, depending on circumstances you may be justified in sending them out of this world. Do not hate. Do not condemn to Hell. That is God's job, not yours.

Loving does not mean approval of acts which are sinful and harmful to one's health, spiritual or physical. That is something many individuals are confused about with love in the world today. We cannot condone smoking or homosexual acts or abortion. Though we may know individuals who do these things, we must despise the sin, but realize these people, no matter how truly fallen they may be (remember, some are worse than others, but none are better. As St. Paul says, all fall short.), are people created in the express image of God by God. It is our duty to attempt to shine the light of Christ for them, so they might see their inner darkness and return to Him.

However, if they are not receptive, then we must not force it upon them, as do not cast your pearls before swine, but merely shake your feet off and walk away. You never know what seeds you plant in your interactions with unbelievers or lapsed Christians which in the end may serve to guide them on or back to the path leading upward and inward to God's country.

"Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love."

God loved us so much He sent His only Son to die for our sins. That is true love. Not that we love Him, but that first He loved us! God is the source of true love and He is the reason true love has so many wonderful qualities and so strong and enduring. It has come from a Divine Source more special than any jewel on this planet and He gives true love its remarkable resilience and strength. So, if God first loved us, ought we also not love each other? No one has seen God at any time. Yet, He loves us and we say we love Him. If we do love one another, then God is in us, the Holy Ghost, and we are in Him. Be bold, the world will end sometime; for each of us this world ends when we leave here. Fear not, trust in God and dread naught.

Do not be afraid to love one another, regardless of what any man says. Do not fear man, only fear God, the great Judge, and Jesus the Advocate, and the Spirit, the Purifier, Guiding Light. Man can do nothing worse to us than what God can do. And yet, God still loves us despite all our faults and having been condemned to death since the beginning of creation with the fall of Adam and Eve in the Garden. God and His love will keep fear and the damage it does at bay. Love each other and act on that love.

To love one another and ACT on that love. To consider the ways we might help others and then ACTually help them. It is not a question of giving, but helping. The rich man could have helped Lazarus, but it never entered his head. The rich man, like many of us sadly, only thought of himself. Jesus illustrates perfectly in this parable what happens when we only think of ourselves and do not help or even think of others. The rich man could have thought of poor Lazarus and given him a place to stay and food to eat and paid for it, like the Good Samaritan. Instead, he just let him die, figuring that that was the end of him. It turns out he was wrong and soon the tables would be reversed. Lazarus was a rather disgusting feature of his world and when he died, the rich man was pleased not to have to pass by him. Yet, it never entered into his head to help.

How is that possible?

Simple, his eye was not on the donut, but on the hole. The rich man cared about all the things that don't count and never considered those that do. Which is, as said earlier, a problem at all of us face at one time or another due to our very nature of being sinful beings. We tend to get caught up in school, work or pleasure and everything in between and forget to tend to our spiritual health and as you neglect a plant by not watering it and nurturing it, if you so neglect your soul, you will have a horrible death. And as a consequence, we also forget how important it is to love one another and do our best to help our fellow men out. This is exactly what happened to the rich man. He lost sight that we are to love our fellow men as ourselves and that doing so would give him far more happiness than if he continued on his self-centered, unloving course of action that ultimately brought him to the pit. We can learn from the rich man's example and strive not to be like him. Everyone on this planet has a purpose, even if it is to serve as a bad example. However, if you nurture and water your soul by the Scriptures and allow yourself to be guided by the Holy Ghost, you will have an absolutely wonderful life from

now to eternity, after all if you have eternal life it starts NOW, not tomorrow. For indeed, tomorrow never comes.

It must be understood between heaven and hell there is a great gulf fixed. It is equally important to grasp the gulf is not of God's making but ours. It is us who keeps us from the heaven He offers freely, yet at a great price.

Put your trust in God and dread naught. Love those around you and ACT on that love. It does not matter if they are the same religion as you, but you still must love and act towards them all the same. That does not mean baring your throat to the Koran following Muslims; but it does mean treating them with kindness and charity until you must act to defend you and your way of life from them. They deserve pity, for as they follow Allah, that is the Devil, as Christ said "They know not what they do." Think how you can help, not how you can "enjoy" life. Helping does not mean simply giving money to those who don't have it, no strings attached, although it might at times. It never means supporting those who do not feel like supporting themselves. For dependency breeds slothfulness and contempt. Dependency destroys the soul. What it does mean is facilitating a way for those who do not have what they need to earn what they need; to bring them the means of acquiring those things which they need. Those things are spiritual as well as physical. A hand up; not a hand out. You will find out the more you help, the more you enjoy real life. Whether it is helping somebody at the office, around the neighborhood or a friend, there is immense pleasure from the result of helping people, so much more than feathering your own nest, so to speak. It is not only more blessed to give than to receive, but it brings a lot more happiness into your life.

This is hard to do. We want to concentrate on what makes us feel good about ourselves right here and right now. We have to be coerced into staying on the narrow path upward and inward. But that is where our home is.

Heaven is at the end of an uphill trail. The easy downhill trail does not lead to the summit.

The time is now, not tomorrow. The time has come, indeed. How will you ACT?

It is by our actions we are known.

Empty or Full?

Luke 16:19-21

First Sunday after Trinity

June 18, 2017

There are many ways to describe the rich man in Luke 16:19. We might say he was fat on the outside and starving on the inside. We might say he was full on the outside and empty on the inside. I think the most accurate would be to say he was wealthy on the outside, but destitute on the inside. The Bible calls him rich.

It means he lived in extravagant luxury. Many of you have heard of the famous horse farms of Loudoun County. These are owned by the very rich. Their drive ways look like country roads, long, winding, paved, lined with oaks and stone walls. Their barns are like mansions. Their houses are like castles, staffed with armies of servants. This is the kind of wealth the man in Luke 16 enjoyed. It is unimaginable wealth. That's the picture the Bible gives of him.

The Bible also says he "fared sumptuously every day." The Greek word used here is the word from which we get our English word "lamp." It has a primary meaning of luxurious. If you and I were ever placed in a situation of having no light at night, we would understand what a luxurious thing a lamp is. But the word carries another meaning, which is bright, shining splendor, glowing like the sun. It means this rich man's fare shone like the sun, glorious and bright and without equal.

We meet others like him in the Bible. Solomon was one. Maybe not quite as wealthy, but certainly qualified to be called rich, was Zacchaeus, as was the man often called the rich young ruler. Each of these men was wealthy. Each had everything money can buy. But, of course, money can't buy everything. And as we look at this rich man, we see a terrible, ravenous poverty in the deep, deep, depths of his soul. His body fared sumptuously every day, but his soul was starving to death.

The man was a Jew. He used the common Jewish reference to Abraham as "Father Abraham." He probably went to the synagogue every Sabbath. He probably kept the ceremonial laws, the feasts and fasts and sacrifices. He probably gave generously to the synagogue and Temple, and the politicians, and charities, for he would have wanted to be known as pious and good, and he would have wanted to keep people, "on his side." But he was missing something. He was missing God.

I can think of another man who was in a similar situation. Though not wealthy, C. S. Lewis was very comfortably situated. His salary was very good. He lived in the country near his work. He was a respected professor at one of the world's leading universities. And he loved his books. He lived for his books. He was an expert in the literature of Nordic mythology, and his imagination was captured by it. I remember being captured by philosophy in college. It was almost a consuming passion. I lived it. Kierkegaard, Sartre, and Kant were friends and I conversed with them through their works. Together we discussed the great questions of life. What is true? What is truth? Is knowledge possible? Can I know what is real? Is anything real? A couple of years ago, while we were meeting in Emmanuel Church, we watched a series of Tim Keller videos. I remember him making a statement something like, we can't prove we're not a butterfly dreaming we're a college student. Well, part of the intrigue of philosophy is the question, am I a butterfly dreaming I'm a college student? Can I know I'm not a butterfly dreaming I'm a college student? I remember a friend from my early teen years who read a lot of science fiction books. He often brought them into our conversations, saying things like, "what if we're not real? What if we're just imaginary things in someone else's dream?" If I laughed, he would ask, how do you know we're not? Can you prove we're not?" That may seem like a foolish question, but it really goes to the foundation of human existence. It asks the question, am I real? And philosophers through the ages have wrestled with this question. Because, if I'm not real, my life doesn't matter, and if you are not real, then you don't matter. And if you are not real then I can do whatever I want with you and to you. So this is part of the two foundational questions of human existence. The first one is, who am I, and why am I here? The second is, who is God, and what do I owe Him?

C.S. Lewis lived in his books and his prestige, and his friends. And he thought he was happy. In his mind, his life was complete. It was what I am calling, full, the way we say a person has a full and happy life. But Lewis noticed the sense of fulness he once had with his literature was gradually wearing off. He still loved his books, but they did not have the compelling appeal they had a few years ago. It was then that he noticed that his literature and his work and his prestige were not enough to make him full on the inside. If he was going to continue to have that sense of fulness in life, he would need to change his focus every few years, taking up new interests and collecting new trinkets as his interest and satisfaction in his old ones decreased. He knew then that the fullness, which he called, "pleasure," had not just gone out of his literature; it had gone out of his life. In his book, *Surprised by Joy* he wrote of his desperate quest to recover it. But the harder he tried, the further it seemed to go from him. After a while, he began to understand he would never find that inner pleasure/fulness in the trinkets of the world, and he wrote a wonderful comment on the folly of trying to find it there. He brought it all to a profound conclusion in the chapter called "Check," saying, "I sometimes wonder if all pleasure is not a substitute for joy." He found himself very much like the man in the Scriptures, very comfortable on the outside, but desolate, empty, and starving on the inside.

Rev Ken Johnson, speaking about Luke 16, once told me he is amazed at how much effort people put into their physical/worldly comforts, and how little they put into their spiritual growth and well being. We put much effort into making our houses comfortable and attractive. For many, our homes are our largest financial investment, and we spend much money and effort making them comfortable and attractive places to live. We also pay great attention to our physical health. We join health clubs and gyms. We try to eat healthy and well balanced meals, and we get proper rest. We also pay much attention to our mental health. We take vacations. We listen to music. We watch movies. We visit friends. We do this to "unwind." We do this for our emotional/mental well being. And these things are, or at least, can be good things. I believe a comfortable, attractive home is a gift from God to be enjoyed and treasured and maintained. Certainly we should pay much attention to our physical health. "Thou shalt not kill" refers as much to yourself as it does to others, and the positive side of this commandment is to do all that is reasonable and necessary to protect your physical health. The same is true of our emotional/mental health. We cannot ignore this aspect of life without displeasing God.

But what do we do about our spiritual life? Do we sometimes let it fade into the background as we pursue our more physical/worldly aspects and needs? Most of us would have to answer that question with a rather humble, "yes." The story of the rich man and Lazarus reminds us that we can be rich on the outside but poor on the inside. We can live in shinning luxury and fare sumptuously everyday on the outside, yet live in poverty and hunger of the soul. Let that not be so of us.

But how do we become wealthy and full on the inside? How can we make our souls full and rich? We need to understand the reason for inner emptiness. We are empty because only God can make us full. Augustine, writing of this very thing, said, "Thou hast made us for Thyself, O Lord: and our souls are restless until we find our rest in Thee." The Old Testament king, Solomon, devoted his life to trying to fill his emptiness. He had wealth, power, prestige, and he used them to fulfill every carnal lust known to man. He found them all powerless to fill the emptiness. "Vanity of vanities," he wrote of such things in Ecclesiastes 1:2, "all is vanity." If you plant a garden, you till the soil, you plant the seeds, you hoe, you water, you sweat, you give up leisures and pleasures to work in the garden. What if the garden does not produce? What if the plants grow and flourish, but there are no beans or carrots? If you have ever gardened you know anyone can grow squash. Most

gardeners have so much squash even the deer won't eat it. But what if, year after year, you do all that work, and you don't even get a squash? Your labour has been vain. Your garden has been vanity. Your work has been fruitless. "Fruitless" is the way one scholar translates it from the Hebrew. Attempts to find fullness without God are fruitless. It is looking for fullness "in a barren and dry land where no water is," according to our reading in Psalm 63. Your soul is satisfied when you praise God with joyful lips. When you remember God in your bed and think upon Him in your waking hours. When you dwell under the shadow of His wings, and when your soul hangeth upon Him. In other words, your soul will be fill to overflowing when you know God in Biblical faith.

Woe to the Wicked

First Sunday after Trinity.

The Collect.

GOD, the strength of all those who put their trust in thee; Mercifully accept our prayers; and because, through the weakness of our mortal nature, we can do no good thing without thee, grant us the help of thy grace, that in keeping thy commandments we may please thee, both in will and deed; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Isaiah 5

WOE unto them that join house to house, that lay field to field, till there be no place, that they may be placed alone in the midst of the earth! 9 In mine ears said the LORD of hosts, Of a truth many houses shall be desolate, even great and fair, without inhabitant. 10 Yea, ten acres of vineyard shall yield one bath, and the seed of an homer shall yield an ephah. 11 Woe unto them that rise up early in the morning, that they may follow strong drink; that continue until night, till wine inflame them! 12 And the harp, and the viol, the tabret, and pipe, and wine, are in their feasts: but they regard not the work of the LORD, neither consider the operation of his hands.

One thing we notice about this section of today's reading is a very distinct compare and contrast.

I use that technique in teaching to focus my students on discrepancies, wide gaps between good and not good, and anything else that will get them to see both similarities and

differences. This is not the Lord's disapproval of the wealthy or those who are successful, no he is reminding them who made this wealth possible. He is pointing out that excess will cloud or block your view of what the Lord has done. "...but they do not regard the deeds of the Lord, or see the work of his hands" We must also see the comparison concerning parties or happy gatherings. Take note of the feasts and happy gatherings noted elsewhere in the scriptures in which with proper regard and without wild abandon, these were well celebrated.² The Lord is using Isaiah to point out excess and giving a warning to those who might party without regard to anything outside their small world.

18 Woe unto them that draw iniquity with cords of vanity, and sin as it were with a cart rope: 19 That say, Let him make speed, and hasten his work, that we may see it: and let the counsel of the Holy One of Israel draw nigh and come, that we may know it! 20 Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil; that put darkness for light, and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!

Wow, how current is the Word of the Lord? With the reality that this has been going on since the Garden, we have seen in the last forty years a rapid abandonment of what was once considered shared social mores. How many times a week do we read, hear, or see this ideal put out as the truth. People calling evil good and good evil. We can still preach to this concept in this country, but our fellow Christians in Canada can no longer point out how wrong that whole concept is, they will be charged with a "hate crime or hate speech". As a nation we have gone back and forth between a broad approach to life and a more constrained one, we had two national revivals in our American history, the Great Awakening and the Second Great Awakening. It is not unfeasible that we may have a third national revival. We have never been nor should we be a theocracy, but we do need to be a nation which respects common decency, law and a foundational form to foster peace and unity, not discord, anger, and disunity, as current laws seem to give rise to.

21 Woe unto them that are wise in their own eyes, and prudent in their own sight! 22 Woe unto them that are mighty to drink wine, and men of strength to mingle strong drink: 23 Which justify the wicked for reward, and take away the righteousness of the righteous from him! 24 Therefore as the fire devoureth the stubble, and the flame consumeth the chaff, so their root shall be as rottenness, and their blossom shall go up as dust: because they have cast away the law of the LORD of hosts, and despised the word of the Holy One of Israel.

These final four verses of our reading give us a dire warning to the behavior and attitude that seems so prevalent in this country especially. We need to take note, beginning with our own lives in modeling the Christ like behavior, giving rise to the question from non-believers... "why do you act so differently from everyone else?" As St Peter wrote, be ready to give answer to that question and others like it, be ready to show why you believe and who you believe in, Jesus Christ, our Savior. Let us meditate on the Word of God this day and throughout this week. Let us try to live our lives as followers of the Risen Lord. Let us reveal his presence to the lost and dying world, each day, every day until he returns in his Glory.

Let us pray:

FATHER as we meditate on your Word today, help us to apply the message to our lives. We ask you be with those in harms way, the young men and women in uniform,

worldwide. Help us as a nation come back to you, for you have the answers to all the problems, concerns, and worries that nibble at us every day, that keep us from focusing on you and your wonderful works, especially in the perfect sacrifice of your only Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Give us peace that passes understanding, these things we ask in thee through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee and the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, world without end, *Amen.*

ALMIGHTY God, who sittest in the throne judging right; We humbly beseech thee to bless the courts of justice and the magistrates in all this land; and give unto them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, that they may discern the truth and impartially administer the law in the fear of thee alone; through him who shall come to be our judge, thy Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

OALMIGHTY God, look mercifully upon the world which thou hast redeemed by the blood of thy dear Son, and incline the hearts of many to dedicate themselves to the sacred ministry of thy Church; through the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*



Rev Bryan Dabney of Saint John's Sunday Sermon

We are fortunate to have Bryan's Sunday Sermon. If you want people to come to The Truth, you have to speak the truth, espouse the truth and live the truth. This is really a good piece and I commend it to your careful reading.



First Sunday after Trinity

As Christians, we know God expects us to be obedient to His will which includes our possessing a worldview that upholds his standards. Nevertheless, for the unregenerate such is not the case as they hold to a secular, or profane morality which is based entirely on human wisdom. We might refer to those who hold such views as "secular moralists", or simply, "moralists." As one bible commentator has pointed out, "... the words moral and immoral... are an affront to God. They imply that man himself can determine what is right and wrong. Eve became the first moralist, as she chose to decide what is good and what is evil. Rebels, like Eve and Lucifer... always claim to adhere to 'what is right'... because the heathen perennially chose their mores over the laws of God."

And profane morality is a most deceitful and dangerous enemy not simply because it is a construct of human wisdom, but on account of its sinister, supernatural nature. In our lesson from Genesis, we read where Eve was beguiled by the serpent to disobey the commandment of God by eating of the forbidden fruit. In so doing, Eve chose to act against the expressed will of the Creator. As the scriptures so state, *And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to*

make one wise, she took the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her: and he did eat (Genesis 3:6).

Consider her first motivation: ... the woman saw that the tree was good for food. The appeal to our human sense of smell and taste is often the first invitation which calls us to a meal. I love the smell of good food cooking, and when someone is grilling nearby it will stimulate my desire for the same. There is nothing unbiblical about that because God gave us a sense of smell to go along with our appetite for tasty foods. Still, sinful behaviors can be masked behind a favorable sense. With the prohibition of God set aside, Eve then relied solely upon her senses to affirm her actions and that spelled trouble for both herself and her husband, as well as for us.

Eve's second motivation was, ...that it was pleasant to the eyes. How things look to us is a sense that is also not in and of itself evil. Even so, evil things may have pleasant appearances that will conceal their true nature. If we are relying upon our own senses, and not upon godly discernment, we will be tricked by the devil every time. The old saying of "all that glitters is not gold" is apropos. The moralist will see only those things that are visible or apparent, and will look no further. Evil is often invisible, or hidden, much as a fowler's trap. The bird sees only the bait, but not the snare which, when activated, catches the hapless creature.

Eve's third motivation rested on the smooth and persuasive message of the serpent: Ye shall not surely die: for God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil (v.4b). Ergo, because it was a ...tree to be desired to make one wise she then completed the work of sin for as the Bible says, ...she took the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her: and he did eat. The apostle James admonished: *But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death* (St. James 1:14-15).

How often have we succumbed to the wishes of others who were themselves mired in sinful activities, and who desired us to join them in their rebellion against the revealed will of God? The devil styles everything he wants us to do in ways which have the outward appearance of being rational, self-gratifying, worldly, in vogue, or titillating. Would you really do an evil deed if he told you the truth about what would happen to you: that God's judgment would come upon you; and that you might even suffer ill effects in your body as well as in your relationships with others?

That's where the moralist comes in to do his master's bidding. As St. Paul noted in his second epistle to the Corinthians, Satan was an angel of light, and he still possesses the power to assume that form again as well as to transform his disciples into faux Christians for his malignant purposes (11:13-15). Our Lord Jesus Christ said, *Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. Ye shall know them by their fruits...* (St. Matthew 7:15-16a). *And, For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect* (St. Matthew 24:24-26).

The moralist may offer a set of ethical values which might bear some resemblance to God's laws. Nevertheless, they are, in fact, merely vehicles to cloud the issue at hand rather than affirm God's immutable standards for living. Consider the words of the playwright George Bernard Shaw in his Maxims For Revolutionaries, "Do not do unto others as you would have them do unto you, their tastes may not be the same. The golden rule is that there are no golden rules."

Another subset of secular morality is paganism which offers a, “Do what thou wilt, but harm no one” approach for human conduct. How nice. But if you are doing what you want apart from God’s word, then evil is present and will endeavour to use your actions to the detriment of not only yourself, but anyone else who might be in the way. The drunk driver may kill himself in attempting to drive home, but he also possesses the capacity to injure or kill others on his route. The serial adulterer may believe that his or her conduct is not hurtful— no blood, no mayhem, “no autopsy, no foul,” but what he or she does not realize is that their behavior is filled with potential for harm to others, as well as themselves. Thus the “do what thou wilt” most of the time rules out, “but harm no one.”

As Christians, we have to exercise proper discernment in all that we do or say. The Bible teaches us that the carnal nature of every human being suffers under the curse of original sin. That is what Eve and her husband brought upon us, and the punishment for sin— any sin— is death. Her desire to be wise and to be as a god led her away from godly obedience to become an instrument of corruption on behalf of Satan himself. That last point is often ridiculed in the profane media, as well as in the apostate Christianity, because as their slate of bible authorities explain, “The devil is nowhere mentioned in Genesis.” These so-called bible experts are loathe to admit that in two places within the Book of Revelation (Revelation 12:9; and 20:2), we are informed the serpent of Genesis is Satan himself. God has cut away his disguise, but you have to regard his word as truth before it will be acceptable to you.

It should come as no surprise that moralists are in denial about the existence of a personal evil. For if they ever admit that such a being does exist— one who possesses powers beyond our comprehension, and who controls legion upon legion of evil accomplices that are ever ready to deceive and harm us— then that would undermine their self-serving morality.

If you accept God’s word written, then you know there are God’s standards for living, as well as those which the devil and his minions have concocted. And by extension, you understand that there are only two folds in this world: God’s fold, and the Devil’s. You cannot abide in both (I Corinthians 10:20-22). You must make a choice between them, and that choice will have eternal consequences.

Moralists have chosen those principles and doctrines that fit their particular lifestyle choices. Many of them have rejected the Christian message because it conflicts with their errant ways and views. As we read in our lesson from Genesis, Satan wants our senses to be pleased by our sin. He wants the poison to taste sweet. He wants our death to God to be preferable to a life dedicated to him. He wants our choices to displace God’s choices. And he would have us all become like Eve— moralists in our own right. And what have Eve and Adam extended to each of us? The curse of original sin.

So, then what can we do? Plainly stated, we do not possess the capacity within ourselves to remedy our situation. The moralist says you must do this, or that, or the other to live rightly. Sadly, there are Christians who harbor a works- based salvation, and they too have a list of things one must do to obtain God’s favor. The Bible says that, *Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners* (I St. Timothy 1:15). *For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life* (St. John 3:16). *Jesus saith... I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me* (St. John 14:6). The Philippian jailer asked of the apostles Paul and Silas, *...Sirs, what must I do to be saved? And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house* (Acts 16:30, 31). The apostles did not say, “You can save yourself by your own merits,” or “You can please God by this work or that and he will give you that saving

grace." Nothing could be further from the truth.

We who are born-again of the Holy Ghost have accepted what God has done for us through the atoning work of our Saviour. We have accepted his free gift to us and we follow his commandments. In order to know God, one must read his word and prayerfully petition him daily. God wants us to know him and he wants us to be saved from his coming wrath. When you come to know God as your heavenly Father, you will learn that he has your best interests at heart. You will also realize that he loved you so much that he sent his only begotten Son to die in your place, to take your punishment for every sin you have committed as well as that original sin with which we were all born. He has done it all so that all you have to do is, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved.

If you have not already done so, I urge you to begin your relationship with God today. Ask him to forgive you of your sins and trespasses in the name of his only begotten Son. And ask him to fill you with his most holy Spirit as well as to daily assist you in living by his standards as expressed in Scripture. You can rest assured that he will hear you, and if you are sincere, he will accept you into the beloved as one of his saints. Do not wait. Come to him today.

Let us pray,

ALMIGHTY God, keep us from all false doctrine, heresy and schism, as well as from all pagan moralizing and deception in religion; for this we ask in the name of thy only begotten Son, even Jesus Christ. *Amen.*
