Screwtape¹ examines the virtue of Humility

Your patient has become humble; have you drawn his attention to the fact? All virtues are less formidable to us once the man is aware that he has them, but this is specially true of humility. Catch him at the moment when he is really poor in spirit and smuggle into his mind the gratifying reflection, ‘By jove! I’m being humble’, and almost immediately pride—pride at his own humility—will appear. If he awakes to the danger and tries to smother this new form of pride, make him proud of his attempt—and so on, through as many stages as you please. But don’t try this too long, for fear you awake his sense of humour and proportion, in which case he will merely laugh at you and go to bed.

But there are other profitable ways of fixing his attention on the virtue of Humility. By this virtue, as by all the others, our Enemy wants to turn the man’s attention away from self to Him, and to the man’s neighbours. All the abjection and self-hatred are designed, in the long run, solely for this end; unless they attain this end they do us little harm; and they may even do us good if they keep the man concerned with himself, and, above all, if self-contempt can be made the starting point for contempt of other selves, and thus for gloom, cynicism, and cruelty.

Propers

Each Sunday there are Propers: special prayers and readings from the Bible. There is a Collect for the Day; that is a single thought prayer, most written either before the re-founding of the Church of England in the 1540s or written by Bishop Thomas Cranmer, the first Archbishop of Canterbury after the re-founding.

The Collect for the Day is to be read on Sunday and during Morning and Evening Prayer until the next Sunday. The Epistle is normally a reading from one of the various Epistles, or letters, in the New Testament. The Gospel is a reading from one of the Holy Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The Collect is said by the minister as a prayer, the Epistle can be read by either a designated reader (as we do in our church) or by one of the ministers and the Holy Gospel, which during the service in our church is read by an ordained minister.

The propers are the same each year, except if a Red Letter Feast, that is one with propers in the prayerbook, falls on a Sunday, then those propers are to be read instead, except in a White Season, where it is put off. Red Letter Feasts, so called because in the Altar Prayerbooks the titles are in red, are special days. Most of the Red Letter Feasts are dedicated to early saints instrumental in the development of the church, others to special events. Some days are particularly special and the Collect for that day is to be used for an octave (eight days) or an entire season, like Advent or Lent.

The Propers for today are found on Page 128-130, with the Collect first:

The Third Sunday in Lent.

WE beseech thee, Almighty God, look upon the hearty desires of thy humble servants, and stretch forth the right hand of thy Majesty, to be our defence against all our enemies; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

And due to the rubric, the Collect for the Day is followed by the Collect for Ash Wednesday, which is found on Page 124:

The first day of Lent, commonly called Ash Wednesday.

The Collect.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, who hatest nothing that thou hast made, and dost forgive the sins of all those who are penitent; Create and make in us new and contrite hearts, that we, worthily lamenting our sins and acknowledging our wretchedness, may obtain of thee, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

¶ This Collect is to be said every day in Lent, after the Collect appointed for the day, until Palm Sunday.

The Epistle for today comes from Paul's letter to the Ephesians, the Fifth Chapter,

beginning at the First Verse. He echoes the advice of St. James in his general epistle to be Christians, not just claim to be followers of Christ, when James wrote, "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves."

BE ye therefore followers of God, as dear children; and walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling savour. But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks. For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience. Be not ye therefore partakers with them. For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light: (for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth;) proving what is acceptable unto the Lord. And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret. But all things that are reproved are made manifest by the light: for whatsoever doth make manifest is light. Wherefore he saith, Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light.

This morning's Gospel comes from the Gospel of St. Luke, the Eleventh Chapter, beginning at the Fourteenth Verse.

But some of them said, He casteth out devils through Beelzebub the chief of the devils. And others, tempting him, sought of him a sign from heaven. The Third Sunday in Lent.

The Collect.

WE beseech thee, Almighty God, look upon the hearty desires of thy humble servants, and stretch forth the right hand of thy Majesty, to be our defence against all our enemies; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Before reading the entire passage, let us take a look at at two particular verses that are contained in the larger text, and as we read, keep these two verses uppermost in your minds:

²¹ When a strong man armed keepeth his palace, his goods are in peace: ²² But when a stronger than he shall come upon him, and overcome him, he taketh from him all his armour wherein he trusted, and divideth his spoils.

AND he was casting out a devil, and it was dumb. And it came to pass, when the devil was gone out, the dumb spake; and the people wondered. ¹⁵ But some of them said, He casteth out devils through Beelzebub the chief of the devils. ¹⁶ And others, tempting him, sought of him a sign from heaven. ¹⁷ But he, knowing their thoughts, said unto them, *Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and a house divided against a house falleth.* ¹⁸ *If Satan also be divided against himself, how shall his kingdom stand? because ye say that I cast out devils through Beelzebub.* ¹⁹ *And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your sons cast them out? therefore shall they be your judges.* ²⁰ *But if I with the finger of God cast out devils, no doubt the kingdom of God is come upon you.* ²¹ *When a strong man armed keepeth his palace, his goods are in peace:* ²² *But when a stronger than he shall come upon him, and overcome him, he taketh from him all his armour wherein he trusted, and divideth his spoils.* ²³ *He that is not with me is against me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth.* ²⁴ *When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out.* ²⁵ *And when he cometh, he findeth it swept and garnished.* ²⁶ *Then goeth he, and taketh to him seven other spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first.* ²⁷ *And it came to pass, as he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, Blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked.* ²⁸ *But he said, Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it.* (Luke 11:14-27)

It is the nature of devils to possess us in obedience to their master, Satan. Demons do not always possess us in great alarm and demonstration, but often in quiet solitude. Satan is not so much concerned with whether you go out and perform all manner of evil as much as he is concerned that you do not acknowledge Christ as your Sovereign Lord.

All of mankind have a sovereign. We are all born into the world as children of darkness. We are born ignorant of our condition and need of a Saviour from our rightful condemnation.

As we grow and learn, we begin to recognize that we are somehow incomplete. We can not be the masters of our own fate and success or failure.

The opportunity of learning of Christ comes at the moments of greatest personal failure. When we are at the last knot in the rope which prevents our falling in the abyss, we then recognize, more than any other moment, that we need a power greater to, and outside of, ourselves to save us.

The Holy Spirit oftentimes warms our hearts to truth and knowledge, yet we are all too prone to reject those approaches over any long period. We offend the Holy Spirit finally when, after his appeals to us over and over are rejected, our ears become deafened to His constant beckoning. He still speaks, but our ears have drowned the Voice out. Thus we have placed our souls beyond the reach of the Holy Spirit and have become reprobate through our own habitual disregard.

This is the most tragic of all states.

Some one is standing by the Highway shouting "Bridge Out Ahead!" but we can no longer hear because we have been travelling too much through the playgrounds of the world and the noisy commotion of the world of sin has caused other sounds to seem muffled. We plunge ahead and perish in flames.

¹⁴ And he was casting out a devil, and it was dumb. And it came to pass, when the devil was gone out, the dumb spake; and the people wondered.

This was not a noisy devil, but a silent one. Yet, this devil possessed the man's soul and heart. Had the dumb devil not been in possession of him, this man may have proclaimed wondrous words of truth to the world, but he could not. His heart was occupied by a devil!

Jesus worked a silent miracle that resulted in the gift of speech.

There are two ways to look at the miraculous works of God:

1. Wonder and Awe.
2. Jeers and accusations.

Some of the big name preachers of the day (Pharisees) claimed the power of Christ was the power of Beelzebub – Lord of the Flies. The larvae of flies on a dead carcass appeared to them to create a low form of life.

A third means is to tempt God to show a sign. The miracle is a sign unto itself.

In today's churches, there is a clamour for signs and wonders, but listen to what Christ says :

*³⁸ Then certain of the scribes and of the Pharisees answered, saying, Master, we would see a sign from thee. ³⁹ But he answered and said unto them, **An evil and adulterous generation seeketh after a sign; and there shall no sign be given to it, but the sign of the prophet Jonas: ⁴⁰ For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.** (Matthew 12 :39-40)*

It is miracle enough you have been born into the world, you see the mighty works of God in Creation, and Christ came and died a redemptive death for you and me on the cross, and that he arose from the grave on the third day and ascended up into heaven in bodily form.

This is a matter of historical fact and not conjecture.

There are demons that wish to have possession of us. And those who have possession of the heart in strength, rest in peace for there is not challenge to their rule in your heart.

If you banish this devil from your heart under your own power, he will return to your swept and garnished heart with seven more and take illegal possession. We must invite a mighty King and a Warrior into our hearts over whom the demon will have no power, and there will be no place for him to come in.

²⁴ When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out. ²⁵ And when he cometh, he findeth it swept and garnished. ²⁶ Then goeth he, and taketh to him seven other spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first.

You may believe you occupy neutral ground in this battle between God and evil, but to do nothing is to stand on the side of evil: *²³ He that is not with me is against me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth*

Even our good intentions, uttered or performed without the truth and power of God are evil:

*²¹ From that time forth began Jesus to shew unto his disciples, how that he must go unto Jerusalem, and suffer many things of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised again the third day. ²² Then Peter took him, and began to rebuke him, saying, Be it far from thee, Lord: this shall not be unto thee. ²³ But he turned, and said unto Peter, *Get thee behind me, Satan: thou art an offence unto me: for thou savourest not the things that be of God, but those that be of men.* (Matt 16:21-23)*

Our best intentions, without God, are all hopeless. We may go to church, read the Bible occasionally, but we all fall short of the glory of God and we are all unrighteous.

⁶ But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him. (Heb 6:11)

¹⁰ As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one: (Romans 3:10)

The very moment we begin to feel that we are good and pleasing to God, this is the very moment we are not so. It is not our goodness that will gain the prize, but our humility and faith.

Place a strong and invincible presence in your heart and it will be safe. The only invincible power that exists is Christ. If we fill our hearts with Christ, full to the brim with His Holy Word (which He is), then will our hearts be safe from the invader who will place us into slavery.

Christ will free us. His is the perfect law of liberty whereby our goods will remain in peace. (James 1:25)

³¹ Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, *If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed;* ³² *And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.* (John 8:32)

If we would be free from the demons in our lives, let us take Jesus into our hearts, giving Him the fullness of every chamber, and then no enemy can take possession, and we will be free indeed.

Today's sermon brought the Collect, Epistle and Gospel together and is partly contained in the forewords above.



Consider these words from the Collect:

... look upon the hearty desires of thy humble servants, and stretch forth the right hand of thy Majesty, to be our defence against all our enemies ...

In the Collect, we ask God look in to our hearts, see our desire to be His children and defend us against evil. That also means we are looking for His Help in the form of the Holy Ghost for the changing of our hearts to actually have “hearty desires” to do His Will and to be “humble servants”, not our usual and customary self centered selves. Quite a combination of thoughts in a small bit of verbiage! It is amazing how much we can put in a short sentence if we use our words right! If we will be follow Him, He will *defend us in all assaults of our enemies.* ² If we will not accept His Help, He will not force it on us. Back to that old, “Thy will be done.” The question once again rises, from whose mouth does it proceed, ours or God’s?

We need to desire that which would place us walking on the path towards God and not away from God. That is we need to refrain from malicious, self serving acts that are incongruent with the message of Jesus and need to instead embrace more Christ like behavior, and more loving our neighbors as ourselves. If that is indeed the backbone of the Law as Christ explained, then we should be focusing our energies on serving our neighbors and behaving in a Godly manner. While this seems like an impossible task, we do have heavenly help, that is, the Holy Spirit.

Today's Epistle and Gospel share the same theme. The theme is that in order to be a Christian you have to act like a Christian and not just say we are. It is quite easy to say we are Christians, it is quite another to act like we are. Again, that is where the Holy Ghost will come in, if we let him, to help guide and direct us.

In His Epistle, Paul tells us in order to live out our faith, we need to make our actions match our stated desires, very much in line with the thought above. Actions! Not just Dictions, but Actions! There can be a distinct difference between the two. If you actually believe, you will act. If you just say you believe, you will not. There is a distinct difference between the two states, action and in action. Faith requires action, unbelief is equal to the state of inaction.

There are how many people claim to be Christian, yet do not actually act on the principles of Christ and follow His Instructions. To be Christian, we have to actually follow those

said principles. The key word here is following or acting. Action is the central theme of the Christian faith, which was first shown with Christ's death on the cross and resurrection. He came to act for us, not just to talk or meditate, but His great plan involved action, though it was painful, it was His action that released us from the wages of sin. He gave us an example to live by, that is to live out our faith through not just the right words, but the right actions as well. We have to live our lives in a manner that reflects we believe the Gospel and is consistent with how we should act, which is contained within the same Gospel.

Think about the Gospel.

It is very important to be unified in our worship and maintain mutual support; a team always beats individuals. That is not to take away from individuality, but rather to note that we need to remember whose side we are on and work together with our teammates. Each of us has been given a specific talent by Our Lord to help further His Cause here on earth. In order to truly serve Him, we must be willing to put aside our old selves and truly accept the regeneration that He offers us and become the New Man that Paul talks about.

The satisfaction of doing a job well done should be enough for our reward. It does not matter who gets the credit, all that matters to our Lord is that we work together with other believers to get the job done and to get it done right. In the end that matters is that we get the job done. If people refuse to hear the Good News, it is not our problem. We just shake the dust off our feet and move on to the next group of people.

There are two phrases particularly worth remembering, "a house divided against a house falleth" and "He that is not with me is against me." Middle ground exists, but it is quicksand. Eventually one has to choose a side. It is very clear to us what side we should choose. The only rational side to take is that of God, that side that will lead us to eternal life not that of eternal death.

And, we cannot keep with the opposition. It is the natural part of the history of the Bible and of life. We have to choose to follow God, as there is no other reasonable option, which will give us the result following God will result in. We must decide who we will follow. We do not have true faith if we do not act upon the words that we speak on our lips, of believing in Christ and His Father.

Christ himself came not to unite the world, but to divide it, father against son. The Jews mistakenly thought He came to unite them against the Romans. They could not be more wrong. He came to divide, to find those that would follow him and also to identify those who will not follow him. Through the Scriptures we can easily tell who is for Him and who is against Him. It is simple, who holds to the principles of Scripture is for Him. They who do not hold to them are not with Him.

You must keep constant vigilance against backsliding, for a fallen Christian is in worse shape than one who was never exposed to The Word. In order to do that, you have to be always constantly acting upon your faith. The Epistle and Gospel both talk about the curious dichotomy; you are saved by faith, Jesus's faith, and your faith alone saves you, not what you do; yet if you have faith, you must act on that faith.

To be a Christian and not a Christian in name only, you must truly turn a new leaf and start on the new course of life with Christ, and not slip back into the old man. This is one of the most difficult challengers as a Christian, but with the help of the Holy Ghost, we can do it. You must receive the Word, hear it, and act upon it and spread it joyously to

others, in order for your faith to have any meaning at all. Otherwise we will have been for the worse than if we never had heard the Good News. It is not a gift to selfishly lock up, but to share and give to others. That is the true joy of the Good News. It is most certainly more blessed to give than to receive in this case.

You must grasp that your acceptance of Jesus Christ as your savior and your repentance is the beginning of your life as a New Man in Jesus.

Will you slip? Without doubt. But, when you do, will you again repent and continue to do your best to follow the Word of God, the Light and the Truth? All that matters is that you get up and do your best not to do what you did to slip. Life is a continuous learning process. Indeed, if you are a Christian that is what you must do. We will always slip up in our lives, that is in our fallen nature. But we have to get up and get back on track, using the Holy Gospel to guide us like the instruments in an aircraft. We cannot trust our feeling, but only our instruments (God's gift of Holy Scripture). You are called to believe and act on those beliefs to the best of your ability. If you do not, then prepared as you were for life, you will so be prepared for the pit. As you read Luke, remember the second half of the Book of Luke is The ACTS of the Apostles, not thoughts, wishes, prayers or meditations.

For, "blessed are they that hear the word of God, and **keep it.**"

Whose side are you on?

forgiveness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

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This morning's Gospel according to Saint Luke covers some very interesting ground. Several questions come to mind almost immediately. From a humanistic, mostly logical perspective we may form several ideas and questions we seek to find answers to, answers I believe can be found in the very text we have before us today.

Motive

Jesus casts out the devil in the person, who was without speech, "dumb". When this was done and he was delivered from the devil who caused this "dumbness", some in the crowd began to question Jesus' motives. A miracle was performed, a person made better, considering his previous condition, and some in the crowd still were skeptical. We are reminded things never change, even when someone does a good thing, someone else will question the motive that caused that good thing to be done.

The next couple of verses is not about church unity, it is about the simple logic of what Christ did as opposed to what some of the crowd perceived. *...every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and a house divided against a house falleth.* Jesus answers the skeptics with a simple passage filled with logic. How or why would a kingdom attack itself to achieve the results of victory? This made no sense. Of course, what is really going on here, the skeptics were trying to remove any divine power from what Jesus did. They were trying so hard to make his ministry ineffective or non-legitimate by casting doubt in to the minds of those who saw the miracle happen.

Note Jesus' miracles, with a few exceptions, were immediate, local and observed by those present, and they were unique from what anyone else had done up to this point in history. In Verse 16 points out a common problem in churches today; a "sign from heaven." This most commonly causes the faithful to lose sight of the Word, which is before us, for our edification, and thus go off on a path of error. Constantly seeking "signs

and wonders", we lose sight of the message already delivered in the Bible in our possession.

Taking sides

*But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil.*³ I think we find here a very clear imperative as expressed by Jesus. You are on one side or the other, there is no middle ground in this epic spiritual battle of the ages. You are either for God and His Kingdom or you are for the god of this world, Satan and his doomed kingdom of hate, chaos, discord, and death.

Jesus elucidates a very clear message. *He that is not with me is against me: and he that gathereth not with me scattereth.* In Verses 24 to 26, Jesus addresses those who profess the faith, but in reality are not of the faith. You could say hypocrite. Think back to the following personages who made professions of faith or such; Pharaoh's forced confession {which he retracted to his utter doom}, King Ahab's feigned contrition, or even partial reformation such as Herod's actions before the death of John the Baptizer. In each case, the person acted as if the message was accepted, then did otherwise. This is how we can explain the great conversion stories in our modern history, only to see the person fall back to their old ways or even worse. Some examples come to mind: Jane Fonda, one of the Jonas brothers, Bob Dylan, and so forth, in each case a big announcement being made about their public profession of faith, only to fall back to their old ways in a matter of a few months or even years. *...and the state of that man is worse than the first....* I remember the great flurry of excitement when John Lennon released his tune "My Sweet Lord". The evangelical world was a twitter with the supposed conversion of one of the Beatles. More stable minds pointed out the lyrics and gently explained he was singing praises to lord Krishna, one of the main deities of the Hindu system.

During times like these the best advice is to heed the Word and look for real life faith.

By their fruits ye shall know them.

Whose side are we on?

In conclusion I'd like to point out something that is very telling in what Jesus said. *27 And it came to pass, as he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, Blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked. 28 But he said, Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it.*

What is Jesus saying here by what he not saying? We are to keep the Word of God, we are not to single out any human being for praise, IF by doing that we do not keep the Word of God.

Is Jesus saying that his mother Mary is not to be worshipped? Is Jesus saying that it is more important to keep the Word of God that we hear rather than praise another human?

This is a definite yes. Mary found favor with God. He used a simple maiden from the hill country of Judea to be the means by which Salvation entered this world, but God in no way made Mary to be an object of worship or veneration. The error of many centuries was reversed in the Great Reformation some 501 years ago this coming October. The Word of God was placed back in the point of importance, supplanting tradition, history, and custom. As citizens of a post-modern world we need to seek that preeminence of the Word in our daily lives, we need to both live and keep the Word of God.

³ Matthew 5:37

So, in answer to the previous question; we need to be on God's side. This battle is not going to end until Christ Jesus comes again in His glory or we be taken to His kingdom. Let us strive to be among those who are blessed as they hear the Word of God and keep it.

Let us pray:

O GOD, merciful Father, who despisest not the sighing of a contrite heart, nor the desire of such as are sorrowful; Mercifully assist our prayers which we make before thee in all our troubles and adversities, whensoever they oppress us; and graciously hear us, that those evils which the craft and subtilty of the devil or man worketh against us, may, by thy good providence, be brought to nought; that we thy servants, being hurt by no persecutions, may evermore give thanks unto thee in thy holy Church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

WE humbly beseech thee, O Father, mercifully to look upon our infirmities; and, for the glory of thy Name, turn from us all those evils that we most justly have deserved; and grant, that in all our troubles we may put our whole trust and confidence in thy mercy, and evermore serve thee in holiness and pureness of living, to thy honour and glory; through our only Mediator and Advocate, Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

THE Lord bless us, and keep us. The Lord make his face to shine upon us, and be gracious unto us. The Lord lift up his countenance upon us, and give us peace, both now and evermore. *Amen.*

Who Are the Blessed?

Ephesians 5:1-14, Luke 11:14-28

Third Sunday in Lent

March 4, 2018

Our Lord is refuting the charge that He casts out devils by the power of the chief of devils. They are saying, His exorcisms are a trick of the devil. He is like a military commander, who orders as small unit of troops to retreat in such a way that gets the enemy to follow, in order to draw him into a trap. That is what they are saying the devil is doing with Jesus and the demons. He is allowing a few demons to appear to be cast out, with the intention of capturing of even more people.

Our Lord not only refutes their idea, He demolishes it. He said He has stormed Satan's castle and is plundering his goods. Our Lord then offers a warning to those He has freed from the demons. He compares them to houses, which He has cleaned and garnished. They are not to let the house stand empty, meaning they are to make Christ Lord of the house; Lord of their lives. If they let the house stand empty, the demon will return with reinforcements, and the person will be worse off than before his deliverance.

Then comes that very unusual blessing from the woman who says, "Blessed is the womb that bare

thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked.” Of course, it is true that it was a blessing for Mary to carry Christ in her womb and nurse Him at her breast. It is also true that there is a much greater blessing regarding Christ. Only one woman could carry Him in her womb. That was a specific calling for a specific woman. But there is a calling that goes out to every person, and there is a blessing that is open to all people. It is perfectly expressed in, the words of Christ, “blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it. Now that’s a real blessing, and I want to attempt to emphasise some of its major points this morning.

The first thing I want to emphasise is, that the blessing is for “they that hear the word of God.” The word of God is the Gospel. It is the good news of forgiveness and eternal life through Christ Jesus. This is what Paul meant when he wrote to the Church of the Thessalonians about the way he laboured day and night to preach the Gospel of God to them (1 Thes. 2:9). Thus, in verse 13 of the same chapter, still addressing the same Church, and talking about the same Gospel of God, the Apostle calls it the “word of God.”

The point I am trying to make is that this wonderful story about God becoming Man and dying on a cross and rising again, and who by His death and resurrection forgives sinners and receives us into God’s love and fellowship forever, is the Gospel of Jesus Christ. And this Gospel is not a cunningly designed fable, it is the word of God.

It is not just the four Gospels that are the word of God. There are those who say the Gospels are true, but the rest of the Bible is just the word of man, and therefore, is of no authority. Others say not even all of the Gospels are the word of God. Only those words actually spoken by Christ Himself, the Red Letters, are the word of God. Everything else is man’s ideas about Jesus, and has no authority. The Bible disagrees. The Bible says Moses wrote under the direct leadership of God. The books of the prophets echo with words like, “the word of the Lord came to me.” The New Testament writers make the same claim, and I venture to say all of you are familiar with the words of Second Timothy 3:16

“All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for instruction in righteousness.”

“All scripture,” the entire Bible, “is given by inspiration of God.” Not just the Gospels; not just the letters in red, not just Revelation, not just John 3:16, all scripture, meaning the Bible is the word of God as though it came out of His own mouth.

So, the Gospel is the word of God, the Bible is the word of God, and then, Christ is the word of God. We are all familiar with the words of John 1:1, “the Word was with God and the word was God.” The “Word” in that verse is Jesus Christ. That’s why John 1:14 says “the Word was made flesh.” Jesus of Nazareth is that Word who added flesh to Himself and came to earth to live as a Man. He is the Word and message of God to man.

The Bible is about Him. The Bible says Abraham saw His day and was glad (Jn. 8:56). Moses wrote of Him (Jn. 5:46). The Gospel is “the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God” (Mk.1:1). Paul wrote, “Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures.” Jesus with disciples on the road to Emmaus, “beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself” (Lk. 24:27). He is the Word Jn 1:1, so to hear the word is to hear Him. And let us not forget the Lord’s words to the disciples on the Mount of Transfiguration, “This is my beloved Son: hear him” Lk. 9:35.

The second point I want to emphasise is, “blessed are they that hear the word of God.” The Old Testament has many invitations encouragements, and warnings to hear the word of the Lord. The New Testament continues that refrain. Jesus said “He that hath ears to hear, let him hear” (Mt. 11:15). “Let these sayings sink down into your ears” (Lk. 9:44). James the Apostle tells us, “be

ye doers of the word, and not hearers only” (Jas. 5:22).

We all realise the Bible is not talking about allowing sound waves to vibrate our eardrums and begin the complex process of transmitting those waves to the brain where they are interpreted as sound. The Bible has the meaning of opening your mind to the word of God in such a way that it finds a home in you. If we go back to our Lord’s words about the swept and garnished house, we understand that something is going to fill it. Something is going to move into it. What will that be? Will it be seven more devils, bringing the ideas and values of the world? Or will it be the word of God, bringing truth and the knowledge of God? The one we listen to, the one we “hear” is the one who will move in because that’s the one you invite in.

The third emphasis is, “blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it.” We are all familiar with the saying, “in one ear, and out the other.” Nowhere is this more true than with the Word of God, and nowhere does it have more tragic consequences. We see it illustrated many times in the pages of the Bible. In the Old Testament, the preaching of the prophets usually went in one ear and out the other. In the New Testament, Christ Himself preached and ministered for three years. He was the light shining in the darkness, “and the darkness comprehendeth it not” (Jn. 1:5). “He came unto His own, and His own received Him not” (Jn. 1:11). His words went in one ear and out the other.

We could easily understand this, if Christ had been speaking to unbelievers. But He was speaking to people who claimed to be His people. He was speaking to people who thought they were the saved and the chosen; the people who were looking for the Messiah, and ready to follow Him at His appearing. They did not listen to Him, and they did not want to listen.

The Apostle Paul, again in his letter to the Thessalonians, said when they heard the Gospel from his lips, they “received it as the word of the Lord” (1 Thess. 2:13). That’s the first part of keeping the word of God. You let it in. You receive it, like a baseball glove receiving a baseball.

The second part of keeping it is letting it have a home in your life; not just as one of many tenants, but as the Owner and Director of your life. It is to make the word of God the source which gives your life its direction and values and understanding about everything from nature to God. This is more than a glove catching a ball. This is more like a stew receiving salt, or dough receiving yeast. It changes and flavours everything else. Nothing is left out of its influence. We could say, it is to become “doers of the Word.” Anything less is to be a hearer only, and, as James pointedly says, hearers only, deceive their own selves (Jas. 1:22).

I close with a question. It is a very personal question, and a very important question. Are you one of the very few who hear the word of God and keep it? Or are you one of the vast majority who hear but do not keep it? Are you like the man in James, who hears, then goes on his way unchanged? Or are you a doer of the word? In other words, are you one of those who receive this blessing, or one of those who reject it? “Blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it.”-

We are fortunate to have Bryan's Sunday Sermon. If you want people to come to The Truth, you have to speak the truth, espouse the truth and live the truth. This is really a good piece and I commend it to your careful reading.



Third Sunday in Lent

In today's Gospel a woman called out to our Lord saying, *Blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked* (v.27), to which our Lord replied, *Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it* (v.28). The clearest presentation of God's expectation for us is found in Exodus 20:1-17, for there we find the Ten Commandments. These were written in stone by the very finger of God himself (Exodus 31:18). And even though the commandments are recited as part of our service of the Lord's Supper; still, it is fitting in this season of Lent that the church should hear an exposition of the Ten Commandments for the edification of all.

The First Commandment sets forth the existence of God. We Christians have been commanded to, love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might (Deuteronomy 6:5). When we speak of loving God, we must first recognize that he alone is God. And there is more to that than meets the eye. Some will claim that God exists, but then they create other deities such as their jobs, lifestyles, philosophies of life, sports teams, etc. which they worship and revere. If one has other things that are more influential— which command greater respect and allegiance than God himself— then such a person is in violation of this commandment.

The Second Commandment prohibits the making and worshiping of graven images. While similar in tone to the previous commandment, it nevertheless condemns the formulation of any image of the divine for the purposes of worship. Remember what the children of Israel did with the golden calf (Exodus 32:1-6). They credited that idol with their deliverance out of the hands of pharaoh. And very many Christians, past and present, have broken this commandment as well. Even a cursory reading of this commandment makes it clear that any statue, icon, image or impression which is held up and revered, is just as much an idol as those produced by pagan humanity for their worship. These are hard words for many because they cling to a man-made tradition that originated shortly after the creation of the Christian Church. Said tradition requires its adherents to worship, venerate and adore artifices of human construction as if they possessed some element of the divine. The devil loves to subvert the word of God with the word of man acting in the place of God and represented as being from God.

The Third Commandment condemns the use of God's name in a vain or frivolous manner. God desires for us to call upon his name in both our public and private devotions. But what he will not tolerate are the ways his name has been trashed in our public discourse. Have you noticed that there is hardly a movie or tv production today that does not violate this commandment? In fact, it is a rare event indeed to attend a public gathering and not hear someone uttering a curse which includes the name of God. If we love our heavenly Father, why then would we misuse his name and make it into a curse against others? How is our love for him who gave his only begotten Son to be crucified on our behalf revealed in that sort of behavior? Job's wife wanted him to curse God and die for well they knew that such was worthy of death. But Job did not sin with his lips against God (Job 2:9- 10) and neither should a regenerate Christian.

The Fourth Commandment calls us to keep holy the sabbath day. God desires that we should pause and reflect on the good which he has done for us. It is not a day to fulfill our lusts and worldly

pursuits. Unfortunately, that is not what a growing number of people do today. Ambrose Bierce once penned in his profane dictionary the way the unregenerate treated this commandment when he quipped: “Work not on sabbath days at all, but go to see the teams play ball.” How does such behavior honor God and increase our fellowship with him? If we are truly born-again, we will honor God by being present in his house on the Christian sabbath to worship him, and afterwards, to rest and consider all that he has done for us. Have you been clothed, fed, and sheltered? Then give thanks to God because it all came from him. Keep his day holy.

The Fifth Commandment calls us to honor our parents and includes the promise: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee. God expects us to honor him as our heavenly Father, and as he has appointed our parents over us, we are to honor them as well. Godly obedience requires us to be respectful and honorable souls at all times remembering to whom we are accountable. Willing obedience is rewarded of God with long life and good health.

The Sixth Commandment's literal rendering is: Thou shalt do no murder which prohibits the taking of human life without just cause. God made this clear to Noah when he said, *Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man* (Genesis 9:6). Murder may take many forms. Abortion is the systematic murder of the unborn in the womb. The womb is the place where new life is formed and sustained. Abortion makes this place of life's beginning the foyer of a tomb rather than the entry way to a productive life. Likewise, suicide, or self-murder, is, in some cases, beyond the sanction of God. Murder in every case, therefore, is man playing God, for only God alone decides the time of our birth and our death. The regenerate person will respect the lives of others and will not take human life without a reasonable and proper justification. One may take the life of another in necessary self-defense, or in defense of others, or while participating in a just war against tyranny or aggression, or while acting in the capacity of authorized officer of the state in executing any just and lawful act (Romans 13:1-10). We should bear in mind that even contemplating the death of an enemy is a violation of this commandment because murder first begins in the heart before it ever comes to pass in reality (Matthew 15:19).

The Seventh Commandment condemns all extramarital relationships and behaviors. God created the institution of marriage, and this commandment protects the marriage bed (Hebrews 13:4). Further, it was given to protect the family and especially the children who are supposed to be the products of a godly union before him. The wails and cries of those who, in our time, have been affected by the dissolution of marriages, as well as those who were born outside the bonds of marriage into fragmented households, must be deafening in heaven. And God, long ago, condemned adultery and fornication precisely because of the misery that they inflict on all involved. God did not create marriage and the family to have them destroyed by the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye and the pride of life. The family is supposed to be a place of refuge from the ills of this world; but it cannot be so when the specter of adultery looms large there.

The Eighth Commandment is simple enough: Thou shalt not steal. God gave us the concept of private property rights with this commandment. We are to work for the things we have and respect the right of others to have their things as well. Paul wrote on this subject saying, *Let him who stole steal no more: but rather let him labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth* (Ephesians 4:28). Theft impoverishes not only the victim but the soul of the victimizer. Success in thieving contributes to more thieving. Where does the thief get his mandate to steal? Is it not of himself and his darkened heart? Is it not on account of the whispered hiss of the serpent and father of lies telling the thief he will not be found out? Most thieves are eventually ruined by their own vain understanding of things. Just as with any other malefactor, the thief will be ensnared by his own mischief and trapped by his own compulsion. And ultimately, whether caught in this life or not, all thieves will have to face the final judge who

will cast them into perdition should they come to him in unrepentance.

The Ninth Commandment condemns bearing a false witness against your neighbor. Matthew Henry once said of this commandment that it “forbids speaking falsely in any matter, lying, equivocating...devising and designing to deceive our neighbor [and to unjustly prejudice his reputation].” Such persons as the busybody, the tale-bearer, the whisperer of ill deeds without warrant fall under the rubric of this commandment . The Scriptures say that all liars shall have their part in the lake of fire. God is deadly serious about the bearing of a false witness for it stirs up strife to no good purpose (Proverbs 6:16-19; Revelation 21:8). God desires for men to be at peace with one another. Bearing a false witness does not in any manner contribute to the attaining of that state of peace amongst men.

The Tenth Commandment: Thou shalt not covet means that we ought not desire any thing that belongs to someone else so much so that we would break any of the other commandments to acquire it. Has not God given to all as he pleases? Did you ask and not receive of the LORD so then you decided to take from others: first in your heart and then by word or deed? Look at what you have and then ask yourself if you would like it if others did the same to you? Reflect first before you lust after another’s goods or possessions or relationships. God would rather us come to him and seek that which is good than to suffer us to act as David did regarding Bath-sheba, or Ahab concerning Naboth’s vineyard, or Cain in his jealousy toward Abel his brother. In Leviticus 19:18, God commanded us to love our neighbor as ourselves which goes hand in hand with latter portion of the Ten Commandments. When our Lord was asked which was the great commandment of the law, he responded saying, *Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets* (Matthew 22:37-40). Coveting puts greed in our hearts and that inordinate desire will never be sated as the Devil will come and tempt us with such again and again and again until we are destroyed. If we truly love God, we will avoid the deception of covetousness.

The Ten Commandments are benchmarks which our Lord has set before us that we might know his pure and perfect will. We who have been regenerated by the Holy Ghost know that apart from his assistance, we could not hope to keep them. They are perfection and we are imperfection. They are absolute and we are ambivalent. They are ethereal and we are earthly. God has set his standard before us to teach us of our need for Christ (Galatians 3:24). And our Lord Jesus Christ expects us to abide by them, not by our own efforts, but through the power of the Holy Ghost the Comforter whom he has sent to guide us into all truth.

Therefore, brothers and sisters in Christ, let us keep these commandments. Nevertheless know that when we falter in them, we ought to confess our sins to God in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and receive his pardon. For, as the Bible tells us, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous and he is the propitiation for our sins: and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world (I St. John 2:1-2). Do this and live.

Let us pray,

FATHER, we beseech thee to assist us in the keeping of these thy Ten Commandments as well as all other aspects of thy moral law; and this we ask in the name of him who kept thy law and became sin for us, even Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
